Interesting Items by "Gadesider"

Food for thought is provided this week by an item from Coventry City, who report a loss of £5,479 last season. We know only too well at Watford what a big loss can mean to a professional football club, but the Coventry figure is nevertheless surprising.

For Coventry were the best supported team in the Third Division in 1955-56. Their average home "gate" topped even the support enjoyed by promotion winners, Leyton Orient.

Clubs throughout the country are worried by the de-cline in attendances. Only two Third Division clubs made a profit last season and the aggregate attendance at League football last Saturday was 843,956, a decline in the region of 150,000 compared with a year ago. Figures at the "gate" will be watched anxiously during the coming weeks-and not only at Vicarage Road!

On the brighter side, how exhilarating it is to see Watford at the top of the table. The team, under new Manager, Neil McBain, has responded well to the challenge and the victories over Gillingham and Brighton were just what the doctor ordered. But let's be cautious about saying too much at this very early stage. Form can be topsy-turvy during the first few weeks of a season. The sensible thing is to take results as they come.

There are other teams in the Division feeling just as pleased with themselves. Coventry we have mentioned. They, like Watford, have started with two wins under new Manager, Harry Warren, formerly with Southend United. Exeter City and Southampton were the victims.

Brentford, four goals against Plymouth Argyle and another four against our visitors today, Swindon Town, are also one hundred per cent, and Watford go to Griffin Park next Saturday. We must not forget sporting Colchester United, winners against Southend and Crystal Palace. Ex-"Blue" Eddie Smith scored a "hat-trick" at Selhurst Park on Wednesday.

Down in the dumps are the Palace, relegated Plymouth, Swindon and even the fine footballing Ipswich Town side. But it does not mean a thing at this stage. The time to take stock of the League situation is AFTER the rush of mid-week matches.

In the other divisions—congratulations to our neighbours, Luton Town, on their four-point start against Sunderland and Wolves at Kenilworth Road. Also to the other one hundred per cent teams, Sheffield Wednesday, Nottingham Forest, Sheffield United, Swansea, Leicester, Bradford City and Rochdale. Noticed anything about their records? None of them have a goal average as good as Watford's!


