



CLUB NOTES.

IPSWICH Town's record of never having been beaten by Gillingham was maintained last week when they drew 1-1 at Priestfield Stadium. As the team had been playing so well lately, it came perhaps as a slight disappointment that both points were not collected. However, to draw on an opponents' ground is always a good performance and considerable encouragement can be drawn from the fact that Southampton, who lead the Division, were beaten in front of their own supporters.

Thus Ipswich are now only seven points behind the South coast team and their chances of catching them have accordingly improved. This defeat of Southampton's was their second in succession (a few days before they were knocked out of the Cup by Newport) and it would appear that they are running into one of those bad patches which most clubs encounter during a season.

Certainly one can expect Ipswich to continue their rise in the League table for the clubs immediately above them —Shrewsbury, Torquay and Colchester—hardly give the impression of being very strong teams and may well fall away before very long.

Again Ipswich did not have the best of luck last week. They led (admittedly through an own goal) until less than two minutes from time only to see a point snatched from them at the last gasp, so to speak. They deserved to win for all through Ipswich impressed as being the better footballing side and, had they taken their chances in their

usual way, would have had both points safely in their pockets long before the end.

The pitch was very bumpy and to play good football on it must have been very difficult. However, Ipswich's measured, thoughtful style of play confused the opposition and, although it did not produce victory, it did at least leave a big impression on the spectators.

The Reserves seem temporarily to have lost their touch. The heavy defeat at Leicester a fortnight ago was followed last week by another reverse at the hands of Leyton Orient. The football was never very inspiring although it was bad luck on Ipswich that they were handicapped by an injury to McMillan.

During the week our manager, Mr. Alf Ramsey, signed on amateur forms Denzil Flanagan from Walthamstow Avenue. An outside-left, Flanagan has made three appearances for the England amateur side and has also been on the staff of Arsenal. He is two footed, clever at ball control and very fast. We all hope he will have a long and happy stay with us.

This afternoon we welcome Swindon Town to Portman Road for a League match. Earlier in the season they beat Ipswich on their own ground by 3-1 but Ipswich have made vast strides since then and should be capable of getting their revenge.
