

Three points from two successive away games. That has been Torquay United's score on leadenly heavy pitches over the past fortnight and it has kept the lads in Gold

and Blue well in the running for promotion.

After last Saturday's draw at Gillingham the League table looked good to Torquay supporters. There were the United in second place, only two points behind Colchester and with a home game in hand. Losing at home to Queen's Park Rangers, Southampton were three points behind Torquay and five adrift of Colchester.

True, Southampton have three games in hand on Colchester but two of those are

away from home.

So Torquay's position looks good enough to shake out of apathy some of our local die-hards who persist in pessimism about United's promotion bid.

NINE AT HOME

Of the remaining 16 games of the season nine are at home. These, of course, include the fixture with Aldershot, postponed due to F.A. Cup commitments, which has yet to be re-arranged but will probably take place in April, giving Torquay five home games in that month. Excitement may be running high by then.

With a little more luck Torquay might have had even better results at Aldershot and Gillingham. The Hampshire club was beaten by the only goal of the game, scored by Don Mills in the first half, but Torquay were so much the better side they could have won by five clear goals had excellent approach work been driven home with

more effect.

It was Mills who scored the equalising goal at Gillingham, only seconds before the interval. It was a cracking shot, placed with care and propelled by that dynamite left foot that had goalkeeper Kingshott beaten all the way.

MORGAN HURT

Gillingham lost centre-forward Ernie Morgan in the second half after a collision with Torquay goalkeeper Mervyn Gill. Morgan was carried off on a stretcher, returned later but stayed on the field for only a minute before giving up for good. Gillingham

fought hard to the end but, in my view were lucky to escape so lightly.

Today we welcome Swindon Town, whom Torquay beat by the odd goal in three at Swindon on September 29th. Since then our old friend Bert Head has taken over the managership and Swindon registered one of the surprises on Saturday when they defeated Bournemouth-Cup tie conquerors of Wolverhampton Wanderers and therefore one of our League's glamour sides—by a 2-1 score.

BERT

For the sake of those supporters who have joined our ranks at Plainmoor in more recent years, Bert Head was one of the club's great stalwarts in the days of Manager John McNeil, skippering the famous £500 side which challenged for promotion. He followed Mr. McNeil to Bury.

We all greatly respected Bert as a player and wish him all the very best in his

managerial career.

Another favourite with Plainmoor fans, Gordon Pembery, is on the books of Swindon as a player. Pembery, of course, left Torquay for Charlton and had a chance to return here when transfer listed at the end of last season.

THE LAST TIME

Torquay United v. Swindon, September 17th, 1955.

Considering their superiority over Swindon, United's 4-0 win was not such an impressive result. The margin could have been much larger. After an unsettled early period Torquay produced some fine approach work that had the Swindon defence reeling. Don Mills opened the scoring with a superb drive when he met a Shaw crosspass and four minutes later Sam Collins scored from the penalty spot. Tony Collins notched the third goal with a brilliant 25-yard shot. United eased off after the interval and the standard of play deteriorated. But Torquay never lost command and two minutes from the end full-back Hilton put through his own goal for Torquay's fourth.




