Ray Chandler (goalkeeper). Played for United in Sibley's benefit match v. Chelsea. In his first season with Swindon, having been signed from Bristol Rovers for whom he made his debut 1953-54.

Reg Hunt (right-back). Another stalwart performer for the Robins. He, too, has made over 250 first team appearances since his initial senior season in 1948-49. Local development.

Stan Earl (left-back). Secured this season from Leyton Orient and was previously with Portsmouth for several seasons. Born Alton.

Jimmy Cross (right-half). Has been almost a regular choice since his capture from Everton. Now in his fourth season with Swindon Town.

Vincent Jack (centre-half). Another player signed during the current season. Made nine Second Division appearances for Bury, his previous club. Well-built pivot.

Jack Fountain (left-half). Recently transferred from Sheffield United for whom he made his League debut 1950-51. Developed by the Sheffield club. Born Leeds.

Maurice Owen (right winger). War-time Chindit. Signed 1946-47 from Abingdon and has scored nearly 150 League goals, mainly from centre-forward. 350 appearances.

Gordon Pembery (inside-forward). Close season capture from Charlton Athletic. Previously with Torquay United, Cardiff
