NEWS & NOTES

Good Afternoon, Everybody,

To-day sees the "settling-down" of League football for the remainder of the season, and with the early rush of mid-week fixtures played, it is not inappropriate to compare the Club's opening programme with last season's. Here is the relative position:

It will readily be seen that there is a point advantage, and although the "goals for" column shows a deficit the "goals against" is a marked improvement; in fact in the last four matches the defence have kept a clean sheet. This, of course, makes for a better goal average. It should also be remembered, too, that of the matches played to date eight have been played away, whereas last season the tally was seven. As a final comparison, taking the same teams played to date this season as last, four points have been lost and ten points gained, an overall gain of six points. So, with a third of the League programme played, and in the record book it may be said we have made a reasonable start, but with clubs finding their true form there is a long struggle ahead, but with your support home and away, there is much to be gained.

OUR VISITORS

This afternoon we extend a cordial welcome to Swindon Town, who were one of the founder-members of the old Southern League in 1894/95, and won the championship twice before becoming members of the Football League in 1920. They have never achieved great success in the League up to now, although this season of course they have had the distinction of heading the table. They did, however, hit the headlines in season 1955/56, when they had such a lot of success in the F.A. Cup.

SAM BURTON (goal): Product of local football, signed for Swindon in 1946.

JOHN NEAL (right-back): A newcomer, he was signed from Hull City after spending one season with King's Lynn. Has been a professional sprinter.

JIMMY LEE (left-back): Signed from Leyton Orient in January of this year. He has had spells with Blackburn and Nottingham Forest.

Lew Clayton (right-half): Signed from Bournemouth during the close season, he was ever present during the Hants' club great Cup run last season.

George Hudson (centre-half): A native of Havant, he was a Professional with Portsmouth before joining the Town in 1948.

MAURICE OWEN (left-half): Born in Abingdon. Shortly after signing as a Professional for Swindon he was the target for many offers from First Division clubs.

JOHN SKULL (outside-right): Joined the Town from Wolves this season. Is a qualified physio-therapist.

JOHN RICHARDS (inside-right): Signed from the Army during last season. A goal-scoring inside-forward.

ANDY MICKLEWRIGHT (centre-forward): Was with Bristol City and Bristol Rovers before joining Swindon in 1955/56 season.

Bob Edwards (inside-left): Last season's top goal-scorer with 26 goals. He joined Swindon in 1956 from Chelsea.

ARNOLD DARCY (outside-left): Joined the Town from Wigan Athletic during 1956/57 season.
