

Let's Talk it



GOOD afternoon! And as we welcome our friends from Swindon might I suggest that we could do far worse than take a lesson and example from our opponents

For the last two seasons Swindon have had to seek re-election, but they visit us today in the role of promotion aspirants who have more than a moderate chance of making Division 2.

No miracle has brought about this transformation. Neither have panic changes. A few new players were added to the strength during the close season, but mainly the team today is pretty well that which did duty last campaign. More than anything else I would say that Faith has put Swindon where they are today—a quality which has been singularly lacking around Fellows Park these last few weeks.

FIGHTING DEFEAT

As only some 40 supporters took advantage of British Railways excellent special train to Brighton last Saturday, it might be as well to make it clear right away that Walsall were far from disgraced in this defeat.

On the run of the play Brighton just about earned their ticket into the next round but it could so easily have gone the other way. From start to finish Walsall gave of a best not seen for some weeks and they came within inches of forcing a replay in a fighting finish which had the Albion defending grimly.

The Hove ground is one of the worst from a Pressman's point of view and I can quite well understand how it came to be stated that Tarrant gave Walsall a first minute lead when in fact it was an own goal scored by the home left back, Jennings. Had Ted had equal success with a shot a few minutes later I don't think even Brighton could have pulled the game out of

the fire. But the shot went wide — and we went West.

LEAGUE EFFORT

I do not think it is any secret that I personally am shedding no tears that we are not in for a long cup run. If the Walsall side is to finish in the top half of the league table next May then a big effort is needed—and one target is more easily gained than two.

If history repeats itself as last season there will be a lot of happier hearts around Fellows Park. Remember it was after we were ousted from the competition at the first round last year that the side began a record run of 12 games without defeat.

To repeat that performance means we must start today with a win over Swindon and though it is a hard task it is by no means an impossible one. I have a feeling that a change of fortunes will start this afternoon — an optimism which I hope is more justified than that of our friend on the Brighton train who assured us from Stechford to Hove that Walsall would win by a 3-1 margin.

VISITORS TO FELLOWS PARK TO-DAY

SWINDON TOWN

VISITORS to Fellows Park today, Swindon Town are without doubt one of the two "super shock" teams of the division this season.

For the last two years Swindon had to apply for re-election, last season being accompanied by Norwich. How the old order hath changed this time, for Norwich now lead the division with Swindon in second place!

However badly they may be faring generally, the Town seem to save their best for Fellows Park and last season they won here, although we evened the scales in returning the compliments on the County ground. Actually of the 18 meetings between the clubs at Walsall, our visitors have won 8 compared with Walsall's 6 and 4 drawn. At Swindon Walsall have won 5 and drawn 4 of the 18 encounters.

Earlier this season there was no indication that Swindon were going to challenge for promotion. Of their opening 8 matches they only won two, but since then they have maintained an unbeaten home record and collected some useful points away from home.

Like ourselves, Swindon are no longer interested in the F.A. cup for they received their exodus in losing by the only goal of the game at Reading.






