We opened our programme in the new Football League Division III with a very narrow win. Wrexham proved to be a very good side indeed. With the game against Hull City this evening spectators will soon sum up the strength of the new League. Most of our early season matches

will be against clubs formerly in the old Division III North.

Before the season opened, most judges of the game forecast that the new Division III would be a very hard league indeed. The fact that it was comprised of the twelve top teams of the original Division III North and South proved the strength of the league. Some followers of the game thought it would be equal in strength to the present Division II. Brighton's experience at Middlesbrough hardly proves that. (Let us hope Brighton soon recover from the heavy blow inflicted on the first game of the season).

Nevertheless, competition in Division III is bound to be very keen, as the top two clubs will be promoted to Division II, and the bottom four clubs relegated to Division IV. Thus, next season six new clubs will be in Division III compared with this year. May Swindon be one

of the top two clubs and not——.

To-day we wish to pay tribute to a fine body of men who help the Club every home game—the St. John's Ambulance Brigade. They give their services entirely voluntarily, and are at your service throughout the whole game. Like any body giving public service, they receive criticism, but they do a grand job of work. BLY (Goal)—5'9", 11st. 7lbs. A native of Newcastle, he is City's longest serving player. He realised his ambition to complete 21 years' service with the Club last season, and now enters his 22nd season with Hull City. A most capable player, fearless and daring, he has become a firm favourite with the 'fans'. During his long career, he has had numerous injuries, including broken limbs, but is still as active and fearless as ever.

HARRISON (R.B.)—5'11½", 12st. Born at Gateshead, but has spent most of his lifetime in Hull. Graduated through Junior sides and became a professional following the England-Ireland Youth International Match in 1949. A very sound player, he uses the ball to good advantage. Made an excellent recovery from a broken leg sustained in December, 1954, and a further operation during the early part of Season 1956/7 DURHAM (L.B.)—5'11½", 12st. 9lbs.

Another of City's long service players, he was signed in 1947 from East Halton United. Strong in both attack and defence and a tireless worker. Originally a wing-half, he has now made the full-back berth his own. Was very badly injured in the opening game of Season 1955-56 and made a good recovery after a series of operations. A great Clubman.

BENNION (R.H.)—6'0½", 13st. 6lbs. Until joining Hull City during Season 1957-58, Burnley was his only Club. He joined them as a boy on leaving school. Has completed his National Service and become a full-time player for the first time. A very strong young player, he has the ability to become a great player.

FEASEY (C.H.)—5'9", 10st. 12lbs. Another local player who has graduated through the Junior sides. Joined the Club as an amateur in 1949 and became a part-time professional in



Supporters' Club Notes

We referred last Saturday to our various schemes for raising money for the use of the football club, and, while the competition, membership enrolments, and the other things, are extremely useful, the most important way in which the public can help the Club is by attending matches

in large numbers as regularly as possible.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Football Club, the Chairman referred to the large increase in the average gate, as compared with the previous season. On examining figures more closely, we find that, in the Third Division last season (and ignoring London Clubs), those Clubs, whose average gate was higher than ours, belong to towns whose populations are larger. (At the head of the list was Norwich, the loyalty of whose Supporters is a byeword in football. Even when the Club had to seek re-election shortly after the war, the gates were the highest in the Division). On a population basis, therefore, the Swindon gate might be regarded as satisfactory, but for one factor. We find, on talking to officials of other Supporters' Clubs, that the Swindon team enjoys better "country support" than most. This means, therefore,
