The crowd had full value for their money. Far from being overawed by a Bolton team that included a forward line reading—G. T. Taylor, Eastham, Milsom, Westwood, Rimmer, City kept on top in the early stages and it was not until shortly before the interval that a brilliant attack ended with Rimmer beating Duke.

The Canaries could not find a way through the visitors' defence, and when G. T. Taylor made it two and, shortly afterwards, Westwood added a third, the game seemed as good as over. But City thought otherwise. They piled into the attack and less than ten minutes from the close Burditt headed home a Russell centre.

Two minutes later Burditt made an opening for Vinall and the centre forward crashed home a shot from all of 20 yards. Then, just before the end, Vinall had the bad luck to see another great shot rebound off the Bolton crossbar. So finished a game that the Canaries, on the whole, did not deserve to lose.

To make this a rather dismal day the Reserves lost their 100 per cent. record in the Southern League, going down by the only goal at Dartford. Lynn, however, found scoring easy, centre forward Fenton netting five in a 11—0 defeat of Bury in the Norfolk and Suffolk League.

City's luck was right out at this stage, for a week later they gave a most disappointing display at Oldham, a club struggling at the foot of the table, who had picked up only one point in the last five weeks.

Houghton, deputising for an injured Pike, gave the Canaries the lead, but Oldham led 2—1 at the interval and although Proctor equalised soon afterwards, two more goals to the home side filled City's cup to the brim. To add to their troubles they were reduced to ten men in the second half when Burditt was ordered off.

The Reserves, however, regained their scoring form, beating Scunthorpe by five clear goals (Kirchen netting two of them) in a Midland League fixture at the Nest.

Gorleston went nap at Sheringham in the Norfolk and Suffolk League, but the best performance of the day in this competition was that of C.E.Y.M.S. who beat King's Lynn at Earlham Road by the odd goal of nine after being behind at the interval.




