

## Notes and News

Last Saturday's match against Newport County may not have satisfied the super-critic so far as the finer points of Soccer are concerned, but we took both the points, and on merit, too.

And it was a remarkably fine goal from Jimmy Fletcher which won this game to keep us still in the fight against relegation.

On the whole we were the better team. We had more of the play and there were several 'near-misses' which could easily have produced goals.

The big disappointment was, of course, the attendance. It was a big disappointment on such a pleasant Saturday, and when I tel! you that this was the lowest figure registered at Belle Vue since the Second World War you can imagine how we feel about it. It is difficult to understand why only 3,907 spectators should be attracted to Belle Vue for a League game, especially in view of the fact that we have given some quite good performances on our own ground this season and actually gained maximum points from the last three encounters.

Our Chairman, Mr. J. S. Garnham, says: "It is one of the worst 'gates' I can remember since joining the directors." I think that all our loyal supporters will agree with him when he says "I don't think we deserve such treatment," and when he adds "We deserve better support when you compare our position and performances with other clubs which get bigger attendances."

I hope that the sporting public of Doncaster will respond and give us their support during a trying period.

## Our Visitors

SWINDON TOWN are, like the Rovers, members of the new Third Division. Playing in the Southern Section of the old Third Division last season, they had a very good season, finishing fourth place, with 57 points from their 46 matches and being only three points behind Brighton and Hove Albion, the club which won promotion to the Second Division.

In the present campaign, they have found progress more difficult and at the time of writing, they occupy seventeenth position in the table, with 32 points from the 34 games.

Here are pen-pictures of the Swindon team which played at Reading last Saturday and lost 3—I.

Goalkeeper RAY CHANDLER was signed by Swindon in the 1956 season after three year's service with the West Country club. He is a native of Bath, stands 6ft. and weighs 13 stones. Right-back JOHN NEAL is a keen tackler and fast in recovery. He joined Swindon from Hull City, after one season with Kings Lynn, in 1957. Represented South v North (Third Division) representative match last season. John has been a professional sprinter. Left-back WALTER BINGLEY is a Yorkshireman and born at Sheffield. He went to the County ground in the early part of the 1957-58 season, making his League debut for the "Robins" then and being an "ever present" since. Has had previous experience with Sheffield Wednesday and Bolton Wanderers.

Right-half **JOHN FOUNTAIN** is another Yorkshireman—this time from Leeds, but he was signed from Sheffield United in 1957, while centre-half **GEORGE HUDSON** was with Portsmouth before going to Swindon in September, 1948. This very strong player belongs to Havart in Hampshire. Left-half **MAURICE OWEN** is a defender in whom several First Division club have shown more than an ordinary interest. Maurice has been sought by Wolves and Arsenal. A native of Abingdon he has been on Swindon's staff since 1947.

Outside-right JOHN SKULL who scored his side's goal at Reading is a local player who has made good. He joined Wolves at 16 and stayed there for five years. By the way, he is a qualified physiotherapist. Inside-right JOHN RICHARDS was signed from the Army last season and he ended the campaign as the club's top scorer with 17 goals to his credit. A versatile player who can fill any of the forward positions.

Centre-forward WILLIE MARSHALL was signed only three weeks ago from Bradford City and he learned his football with a Scottish junior club, coming "over the border" three years ago. Inside-left ANDY MICKLEWRIGHT has had experience with both Bristol Rovers and Bristol City. He went to Swindon in the 1955-56 season. He is a Londoner, while outside-left ARNOLD DARCY hails from Lancashire. Born at Blackburn, he went south from Wigan Athletic in the 1956-57 season. An "ever-present" last season. Another player available is "BILL" ROOST who was previously with Bristol Rovers.


