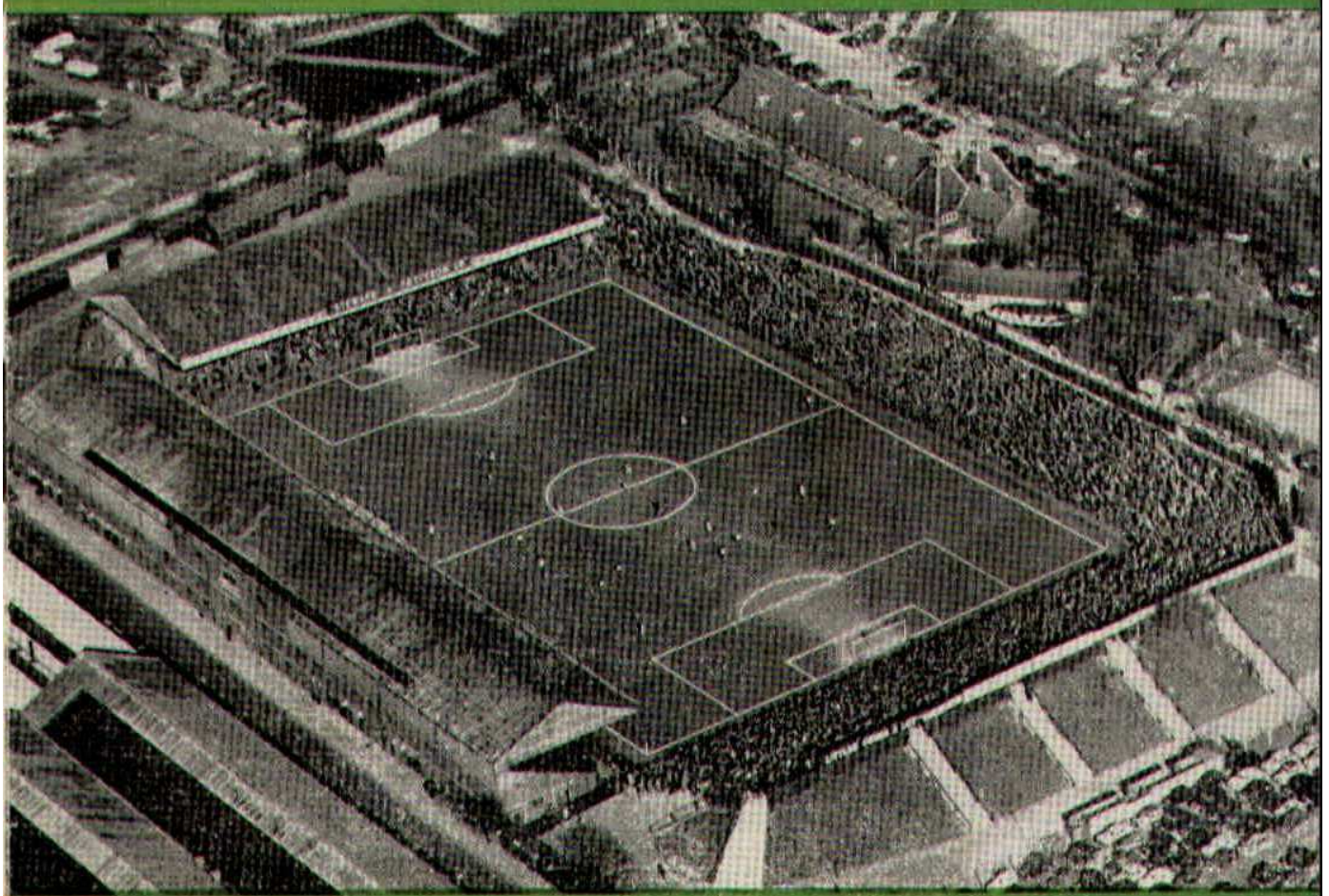

Programme Notes

Today we welcome Swindon Town, who have proved themselves to be difficult opponents on many occasions in the past, and perhaps the most memorable match for many people of recent times would be the second round F.A. Cup match of last season. After battling for honours at the County Ground, when you will remember it finished all square at one goal each, the mid-week replay was a "battle royal" which we managed to win by one goal to nil. It would, therefore, suggest that we can expect a great struggle again to-day.

On Saturday next our long Cup trail to Wembley for this season commences with the visit of Reading to Carrow Road. Reading did not get off to a very good start, but have been doing very much better of late and we can be assured that Harry Johnston's boys will make us fight every inch of the way now that we are getting heavier grounds.

This is not an "all-ticket" match and full Season Ticket holders have the option of claiming a seat by applying at the Office, either personally or by post, enclosing No. 1 Reservation Slip from their Season Ticket Book and particulars of their name, block, row and seat number. If postal applications are made, would Season Ticket holders please enclose a stamped addressed envelope. Owing to the fact that Reading have claimed their full allocation of our seating accommodation, Supplementary Season Ticket holders may apply by the same procedure for a ticket for admission to either the Enclosure at 3/—, or the South and Barclay Stands at 2/6d. each.

The sale of tickets will commence on Sunday next, 8th November, 1959, at 10 a.m.—12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m.—4.30 p.m., also from Monday to Thursday next week between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. A limited number of Enclosure tickets will be on sale to the general public after our Season Ticket holders' option expires on Thursday next at 5 p.m. We would point out that this arrangement applies only to the Enclosure and not to any other part of the ground; also there will be **NO SEATING ACCOMMODATION AVAILABLE FOR SALE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC.** Barclay and South Stand season ticket holders will be able to gain admission by producing their Season Ticket Book at their usual turnstile on payment of 2/6d. **PLEASE NOTE THAT NO TELEPHONE BOOKINGS WILL BE ENTERTAINED.**

OUR VISITORS

Swindon Town and Norwich City are old friends. Swindon were founded in 1881, more than 20 years before Norwich, but like City they spent the first part of their career in the old Southern League and, like City, they became founder members of the Third Division in 1920.

But unlike the Canaries they have never been out of the Third Division, though they have come close to it on several occasions. No fewer than four times they have finished fourth in the section (last time in 1948-49) and a couple of seasons ago they and City ran neck and neck for a time at the top of the table.

The two clubs have been companions in distress, too. Three seasons ago, when the financial crisis hit Carrow Road, it was Swindon who had to apply for re-election along with City.

Known as the "Robins" (because of their red shirts) or the "Moonrakers," Swindon have always been respected opponents of the Canaries. One has to go back to the early years of the century, however, to find their greatest player. It was then that Harold Fleming made more than a dozen appearances for England—a fact that has been commemorated by a memorial at the County Ground.

Bert Head, Swindon's present manager, has done a fine job of work in building up his club's strength in recent years. His side contains plenty of experience—centre half George Hudson is one player who should by now know nearly every blade of grass at Carrow Road!—but he has not been afraid to introduce youth into his line-up. Two youngsters who are currently rated highly at the County Ground are left half Woodruff and inside right Ernie Hunt.

Swindon's biggest close-season capture was Jimmy Gauld, the former Plymouth inside forward. Manager Head paid a sizeable fee for Gauld, who has recently regained

the form, at centre forward, that has made him a thorn in the side of the City defence on past occasions. Another new signing is full back Mike Lyons, signed only a week or so ago from Bournemouth. City will need to watch the Swindon attack in particular, for Gauld has the support of two fine wingers in Darcy and Hoskins, the latter of whom will be remembered at Norwich from his Southampton days.

REMEMBER THEIR LAST VISIT?

City and Swindon met twice at Carrow Road last season—once in a Cup replay (the match that gave the Canaries their chance of a tilt at Manchester United) and once in the league. The Third Division clash, however, was the last visit of the Wiltshire club.

It was not a memorable game, although 29,156 spectators came along to Carrow Road on April 8th to watch it. In fact, the Canaries gave a display well below their usual standard—they were then, of course, playing on the average three matches a week—and to the disappointment of a promotion-hungry crowd they dropped their first home point since the visit of Newport on the 20th December.

Swindon played hard and gave a much better performance than their then league position led one to expect. Their half back line of Fountain, Hudson and Tilley gave nothing away and in attack they had a centre forward in Marshall who was continually harrassing the City defence.

If anything Swindon looked the more dangerous side before the interval, but it was not until the 65th minute that a defensive slip allowed Richards to slip the ball to Marshall, who deflected it into the net with Kennon making no effort to save.

Crowe and Ashman were the men who put the Canaries back into the game after that; but the equaliser did not arrive until eight minutes from the end when Ashman put Crowe in possession and from the left half's centre Bly rose high to head the ball home

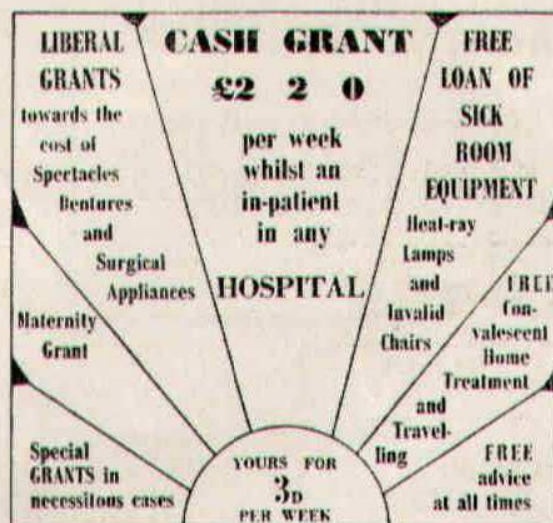
