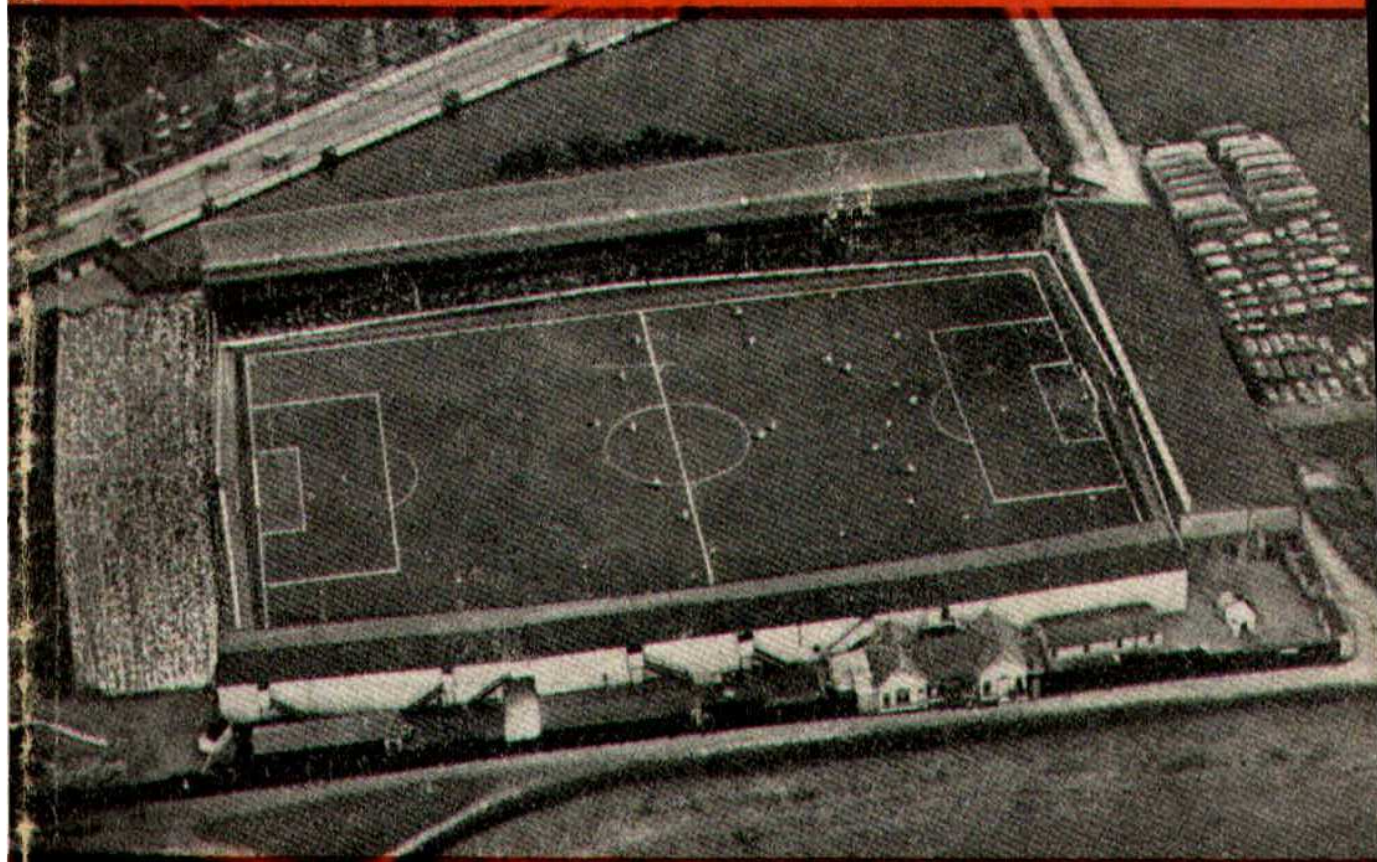

CLUB NOTES

The win at Southend was well deserved, and of course the gaining of two points helped considerably to consolidate our position, away from the bottom four places. As Southend is below Swindon in the League Table, the gain is as good as four points.

Swindon played by far the better football, and the attack always looked far more dangerous than that of our opponents. The line worked together, ably supported by the half-backs. The defence was never in any great difficulty, and Sam Burton was very sound in goal.

Although Layne scored all three goals, the real credit for the first one must go to Marshall, who beat goalkeeper Threadgold with a splendid header, from a cross by Morgan, only to see the ball hit the underside of the cross-bar, and bounce down behind the goalkeeper. Again it was Marshall who supplied the through pass for Layne to run on to and score the second goal. The third goal came from a free-kick just outside the penalty area.

Unfortunately the Reserves lost at home to Plymouth by two goals to nil. Swindon was handicapped by injuries to centre-half Mellor and centre-forward Skull.

The game today will be one of the keenest, and most important matches of the season. Over the past years, we have enjoyed many fine encounters with Norwich. Supporters will remember the two great games at home last year.

The Band which is playing for your entertainment this afternoon appears by kind permission of Lieutenant-Colonel G. F. Woolnough, M.C., Officer Commanding 1st Battalion The Duke of Edinburgh's Royal Regiment.

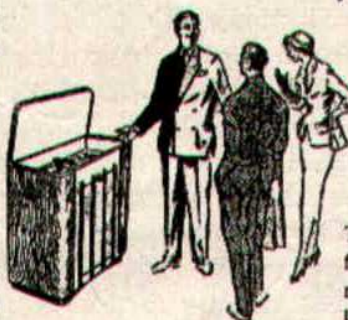
