CLUB NOTES

The season beginning today appears to be one of great possibilities for the club. We have a large number of young players (approximately 60) on the books. Should these lads develop as we hope they will, then the future is very bright indeed.

The club will also participate in two new competitions, the League Cup and the Wessex League. The games in the latter competition are for youths under 18 years of age, and will be played in the evenings. The league's main function is to provide matches for the young professionals.

New floodlights are being installed, and these will be a great asset to the club. It is hoped to have them working by the end of September. All Saturday afternoon games will then begin at 3 p.m. right throughout the whole season. Evening games at the beginning and end of the season will kick-off at 7.30 p.m.

The lights will be used for the Wessex League games and also various other matches, as we now play in six league competitions, English League Division 3, London Combination, Wiltshire Premier, Hellenic, Wessex and Borough Leagues. Thus commitments are very large, and on some Saturdays the club will field as many as seven teams. Not only are players required, but also men in charge, transport, kit, to say nothing of the laundry involved later.

Another project embarked upon by the Board is the provision of a hostel for the apprentice professional who comes from another district. Accommodation is becoming increasingly difficult in Swindon and it has only been due to the kindness and generosity of many BE A GOOD SPORT



Just forty years have passed since the formation of Division III, and, unless memory is at fault, Southend and Swindon are the only original members with unbroken periods of membership. Provided, of course, that exit could be made "upstairs" and not through the "basement", we should be glad to terminate our association with Division III at the end of the season.

There has been unrest in the higher circles of the football world during the close season, both amongst Officialdom and the Players. All lovers of football will hope that the differences may be resolved happily, so that the main business on the agenda—the provision of entertainment at its highest level—may proceed without friction.

Few would dispute that there is much to be done to achieve this, but commonsense and goodwill on all sides could bring it about.

The comfort of spectators is another matter which, in the near future, must receive the attention of administrators. Refreshment and toilet facilities at most grounds are extremely primitive, and will have to be modernised.

Nevertheless, and in spite of increased charges, association football remains a cheap form of entertainment.

It must be remembered, however, that in addition to paying admission charges, a large proportion of the spectators contribute to the welfare of the clubs by other means. We, ourselves, provide a number of ways in which this may be done, and details of these will be given in future notes. We trust that generous support, which we have received in the past, will again be forthcoming.
