After the match Bournemouth manager Mr. Don Welsh said that he was pleased to get away with a point.





OLD RIVALS FROM THE NORTH

S INCE its formation in 1958 the Third Division has been dominated by clubs from the South, but a number of Northern teams will be visiting Ashton Gate this season for the first time for many years.

These include Bradford City, who beat Bristol City 2-0 in the opening match of the season at Valley Parade, Chesterfield, Halifax Town and Tranmere Rovers.

Bristol City and Bradford City first met in the Yorkshire club's first season in the Football League in 1903-04, in the Second Division. Further games followed between the clubs in the First and Second Divisions. City were promoted in 1906 and Bradford followed them two years later.

When City were relegated in 1911 to Division II, the clubs did not meet again until 1923-24, after both of them had spells in the Third Division North and South, respectively.

Bradford left Division I in 1922, lost their Second-Division status in 1927, regained it in 1929 and stayed there until 1937. City went down after one season in 1924, returned in 1927 and remained until 1931-1932, which was when the clubs last met, 29 years ago.

First visits to Ashton Gate

Chesterfield competed along with City in the Second Division in the early 1900's, but on being relegated in 1909 failed to gain re-election with the result that they did not return to the Football League until the formation of the two Third Divisions in 1921.

The clubs met again in 1931-32 in the Second Division, which was their last meeting.

Halifax Town and Tranmere Rovers joined the Third Division on its inception. Halifax have yet to gain higher status, but Tranmere had one season in the Second Division in 1938-39. Neither of these clubs has visited Ashton Gate in League or Cup matches.

Bristol City's Cup history includes matches with Bradford City home and Tranmere Rovers away. Bradford City were beaten 2-0 at Ashton Gate in 1919-20, and on City's only visit to Tranmere in 1932-33, they lost 3-2.
