OUR VISITORS

CHESTERFIELD F.C.

The Chesterfield Club, known throughout the country as the team of the "Crooked Spire", can claim to be one of the oldest clubs in the country, having been formed in 1866. They first became members of the Football League (Second Division) in 1899 and remained so until 1909. They continued as members of the Midland Counties League until the formation of the Third Division (Northern Section) in 1921, being one of the prime movers in the formation of this competition. They have had their "ups and downs" having been relegated on three occasions from Division 2—in 1909, 1933 and 1951—while they were Champions of Division 3 (Northern Section) in 1931 and 1936.

- RONALD POWELL (Goalkeeper).—Born at Knighton, Radnorshire. Commenced with Manchester City as understudy to the late Frank Swift. Transferred to Chesterfield in 1952 and was a regular first team player until displaced by Gordon Banks who subsequently moved on to Leicester City. Recently regained his position and playing exceptionally well.
- GERALD CLARKE (Right Back).—A local from Barrow Hill. Was a member of the Chesterfield Schools team which reached the semifinal of the English Schools Shield. Later joined Chesterfield, after a short spell with Sheffield United Juniors. A real utility player who has been tried in all positions, apart from goal, but prefers full back.
- GERALD SEARS (Left Back).—Another local lad, from Arkwright Town, who came to Chesterfield as an outside-left but quickly moved to the full back position where he has been a regular first team player for the past three seasons.
- DAVID BLAKEY (Centre Half-Back).—Born at Newburn, Northumberland, and signed for Chesterfield when 17 years old. Has been one of the stalwarts of the side for many seasons and is also the captain.
- JOHN ALLISON (Right Half-Back).—Born at Cramlington, Northumberland, and signed by Chesterfield at the end of his Army service. Has not played many times in the League side, owing to the consistent form of Blakey, but given very good service in the Reserve (Central League) team.
- DAVID GILBERT (Outside Right).—Born at Smethwick, Staffs. A newcomer to Chesterfield this season who has quickly earned his place in the first team. Previously with Redditch Town.
- KEITH HAVENHAND (Inside Forward). Born at Dronfield, Derbyshire. Was signed by Chesterfield as soon as he left school, after being a member of the team which reached the final of the English Schools Shield. Immediately became one of the Junior Team which reached the final of the F.A. Youth Challenge Cup Competition in 1954-55.

CHARLES RACKSTRAW (Inside Forward). — Another from Sheffield who has made his way from the Junior team and, like Havenhand, was in the side which reached the final of the F.A'. Youth Challenge Cup. Completed his National Service last year.

JAMES MADDISON (Outside Left).—Born at South Shields. An experienced winger who has seen service with Middlesbrough, Darlington and Grimsby Town before being transferred by the latter club to Chesterfield, in March, 1958.

TERENCE FOLEY (Centre Forward).—Another newcomer to Chesterfield, being transferred from Portsmouth during the summer. Made a number of appearances in Portsmouth's League Team last season.


