CLUB NOTES

This evening marks another important step forward in the efforts to provide first-class amenities for football in Swindon. Only two years ago an important project was embarked upon, namely the new double decker stand, now covering the whole of the Shrivenham Road side of the ground, at the cost of £28,000.

That provided another thousand comfortable seats, with the best view of the game of any stand in the country. The price of the seats are 6/- in the centre, 5/- Blocks B and D side stands, and 3/6 portions at each end. Very cheap indeed, especially when compared with prices on other grounds. Bristol City, for example, charge 7/6 per seat in the new stand, and 6/6 per seat in the old stand.

Covered accommodation is also provided for something like 6,000 spectators at 2/6 each.

The new Floodlighting system, approximate cost £15,000, will provide wonderful facilities for the Club. Evening games will begin at 7.30 p.m., and that fact should help to increase the number of spectators as against a 5.30 p.m. start. All Saturday afternoon games will begin at 3 p.m., and again that time of kick-off should help to increase the size of the gate.

Spectators should be able to follow every inch of the game, such is the power of the lights. The erection of the pylons and lights has caused much interest, and not a little surprise, especially at the speed of the erection. The pylons are quite attractive, if one can use that word, and are certainly landmarks for the surrounding countryside. We hope this evening's game will provide a spectacle comparable with the Floodlighting.

The probable Watford team is:—

DAVE UNDERWOOD (Goalkeeper)—Rejoined the Club for a third spell in April last after being with Liverpool and Dartford. Dave is a part-time player, carrying on a haulage business during the week.

BOBBY BELL (Right Back)—Joined Watford from Ayr United in May 1957. Started last season in the Reserve side, but was recalled for first team duty prior to the Cup Tie with Birmingham and retained his place to the end of the season.

KEN NICHOLAS (Left Back)—Signed from Arsenal in 1959, Ken was born at Northampton and gained honours as a Schoolboy and Youth International. Only missed three appearances last season through injury.

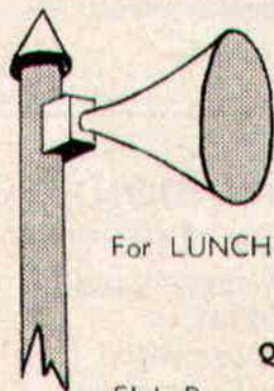

☆ ☆ ☆

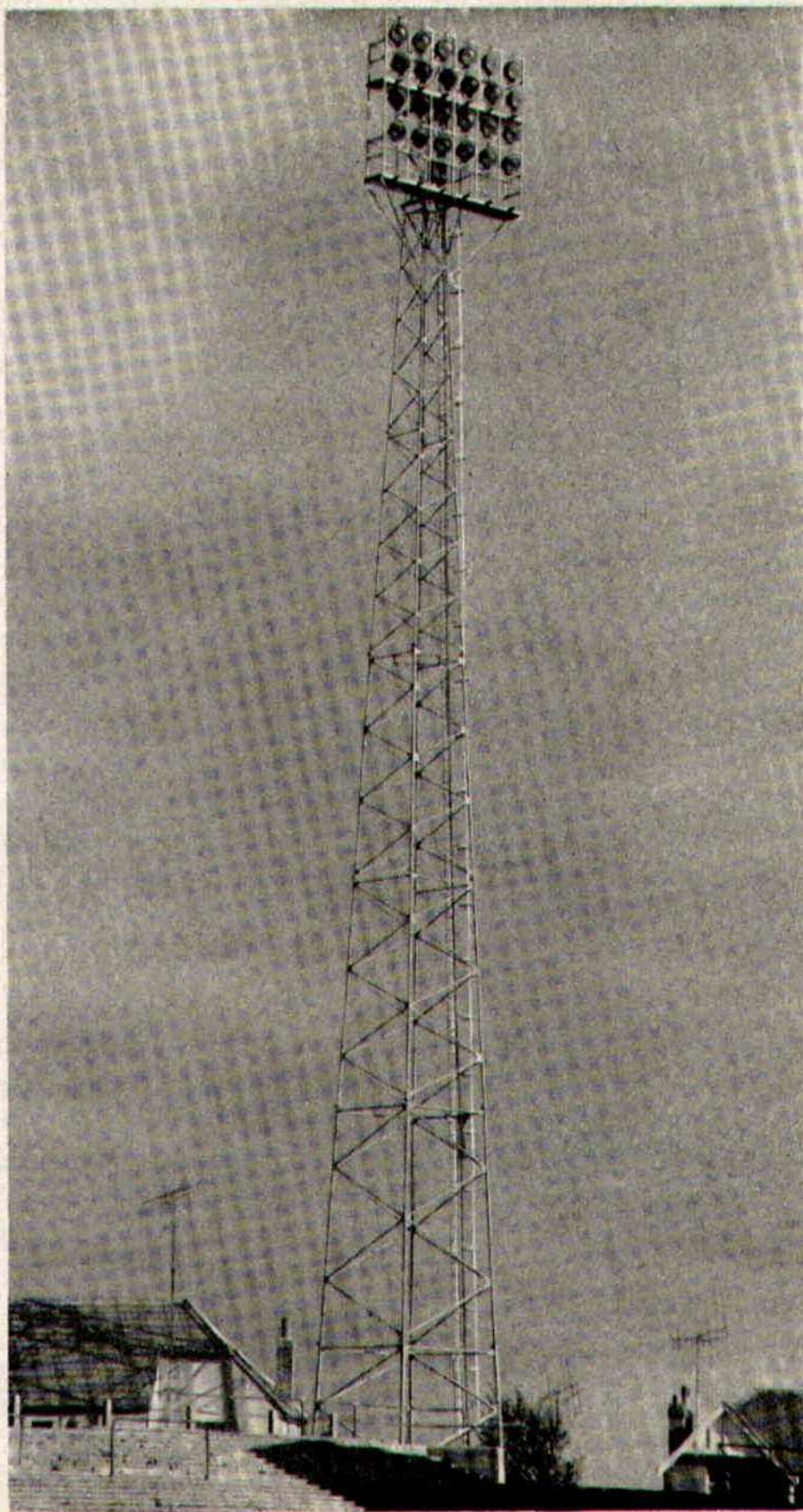

FLOODLIGHTS—continued

Each of the four towers (a photograph of one of them appears on page 12), is fitted with 24 floodlights complete with 1500 watt lamps. A total of 96 floodlights mounted at the top of 120 feet pylons is designed to give the best possible lighting for the ground.

The total cost of the installation is expected to be in the region of £15,000 and the Supporters' Club has undertaken to defray most of the cost. Here, we would like to pay tribute to the wonderful work of that Club without which such a lighting system would not have been possible.
