The defence was most impressive, just a slight error of judgment bringing about the only goal scored. Nevertheless all will congratulate the "Young Robins" on a fine fighting display, and also on having played so well throughout the season, to figure in the last eight teams in a competition with an entry of something like 300 associations.

Born Abingdon. Assisted the Club as an amateur player from September 6th, 1956 until he signed as a professional player on February 3rd, 1958. Made his first team debut on December 20th, 1958, versus Queen's Park Rangers.

WILLIAM DAVIES (Centre Half)

Born Middlesbrough. Joined the Club whilst doing his National Service, on January 7th, 1953, having previously assisted Hull City and Leeds United. Played for the Football Combination versus Dutch XI, in Amsterdam, on April 8th, 1959.

JIMMY WHITEHOUSE (Inside Forward)

Born West Bromwich. Transferred from West Bromwich Albion F.C. his only other professional Club on July 17th 1956. Prior to signing as a professional Jimmy was an amateur player at the Hawthorns for four seasons.

WILLIAM LACEY (Centre Forward)

Born Tynemouth. Joined the Club on July 24th, 1959, when he was transferred from Aldershot F.C., for whom he played for six seasons. Prior to joining Aldershot, assisted Middlesbrough F.C.

DAVID MEESON (Goalkeeper)

Born Oxford. Transferred from Wolverhampton Wanderers F.C., on August 10th, 1954, upon his release from the Royal Air Force. Selected as a Reserve for England Under 23 XI versus Italy, in January, 1955.

JOHN McILVENNY (Outside Right)

Born Barnstaple. Transferred from Bristol Rovers F.C. on June 6th, 1959. Prior to joining the Bristol Club, in 1952, whom he assisted for seven years, John played for West Bromwich Albion F.C., from 1949 to 1951.

GORDON NEATE (Full Back)

Born Reading. Joined the Club's ground staff upon leaving school in April, 1956 and has graduated through the Club's Minor and Youth Teams. Signed as a professional player on March 17th, 1958. Made his first team debut on April 20th, 1959, versus Colchester United F.C.

Born Benson, Oxon. Recommended to the Club as an amateur player in season 1954-55. Signed as a professional player on October 3rd, 1955. During his period of National Service assisted the Army F.A. XI at home and abroad on numerous occasions.


