One is entitled to feel that each and every player in the professional game will see the possibilities and I personally would think that he will feel that at last there is some real reason other than personal pride for working at his job and improving his own personal skill. Even those players who thought that they were at the top of the tree and beyond improvement-and there were some-will have to work hard and by so doing will no doubt improve themselves. Many people who did stay outside the game because of the wage structure will surely feel strongly tempted to get into it because it would seem at last to be a worth while profession. There is no doubt that this could well be the beginning of a new era in the game. There is much talk of a League for the select few with International Competition and so on. I have no doubt that this will eventually "arrive". The Sheffield Wednesday Club is taking a far sighted view and has obviously got its sights set on such a Competition. How nice it would be if we at Coventry could be in such a position. Is it a possibility? Nothing is impossible to people with sufficient determination and will to succeed-given a fair chance with a few of "the breaks" thrown in. The determination is here; the will to win is here; within certain limits we can control "the breaks", but not altogether. I am not forecasting Second Division football next season; I am not forecasting First Division football the season after; in fact, I am not forecasting at all. I am saying, however, that we realise the possibilities and are going to make a determined effort to get where we all feel this Club should be. It may take time; it will not easily be accomplished, but the effort is most certainly going to be made. Wish us well, and aid our efforts.



# Talking Football

Swindon Town are the first visitors of the season at Highfield Road. It is not inappropriate that the Wiltshire Club should open a new football era for the supporters of Coventry City.

Many bold and big changes in the Football League since April will act as a challenge to each of the 92 clubs. Swindon Town made bold and big changes even before the League decided to remove the maximum wage regulation.

Managed by Bert Head, they fielded one of the youngest teams in League history for most of last season. Familiar faces disappeared-but the side flourished,

Every Third Division Club-and those in the Fourth too-must find their own solution of a problem which has grown even more pressing this summer. How to compete with the big-money clubs in the First and Second Divisions?

Many pessimists claim that there is no solution. The lure of higher wages, they say, will cause every promising player in the lower divisions to seek fame and fortune with the wealthy clubs of the land. Inevitably it will mean the end of Third and Fourth Division football as a major force in Soccer entertainment. What nonsense! It ignores the spirit and determination which has caused the lower ranks of the football world to provide first-class shows in recent years.

Johnny Byrnc, one of England's brightest young stars, stays with Crystal Palace. Only an unfortunate injury prevented him from emulating the feat of our own Reg. Matthews in winning a full England cap while playing outside the First and Second Divisions.

Many Third and Fourth Division Clubs have been unable to pay their men the old maximum wage of £1,040 a year in past seasons. Yet I, like many other critics, have been astonished at the improvement in the standard of football in these divisions in the last two years.

The lower divisions are full of young and enthusiastic managers, eager and able to experiment with new ideas. More so than in the top divisions, they are backed by young and energetic directors.

Swindon are one of the clubs who have showed that they are able to meet the challenge of the new football age. The coming months will show that many others are at least as adaptable as their bigger and more fortunate brothers.


#### PEN PICTURES

JOHN TROLLOPE (L.B.) A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960-61, when he was 16 years old and was ever present during that season. KEITH MORGAN (R.H.) A strong, attacking wing-

ERNIE HUNT (I.R.) Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the First Team at 16 years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he is just eighteen years old. Was top goal scorer 1960-61.

KEN McPHERSON (C.F.) Recently signed from Newport County, he is a player with a reputation for hard work and goal scoring ability. Well-known to the Highfield Road crowd.

RALPH HUNT (I.L.) Joined the 'Town' from Grimsby during the close season. He is expected to give the attack some much needed goal power. Previously with Portsmouth, Derby County and Norwich. He was a leading goal scorer at Norwich for several seasons.




