# **Our Visitors**

HULL CITY

This afternoon we welcome as our visitors Hull City. Having made a fairly good start to the season they will, no doubt, be anxious to add to their points total today, and we can expect a stern struggle.

The probable team is:-

Fisher, Bernard (Goalkeeper)

Born at York. Signed as an amateur after completing his National Service and following trials was signed full time professional in November 1955. Missed only one first eleven game last season and has proved a very capable player.

Bulless, Brian (Inside Left)

A local born player, he is equally well at home in any of the left positions, and has played outside left, inside left, wing half and full back with marked success in all positions, but he prefers wing half. Joined the Club as an amateur in 1948 and graduated through the Junior sides, becoming a professional in season 1950-51. A fine ball player, he is fast and strong and well fitted for any position. Many clubs have sought the services of this capable player.

Davidson, Andrew (Right Back)
A Scot, he joined City in 1948 and graduated through the Junior sides. Is at home in practically any position, but prefers right half. Very strong, he is a fearless player both in attack and defence. "Jock" as he is popularly known, has fought his way back to fitness after having sustained broken legs on three occasions. A grand team man, he captained the team during the latter part of last season.

Feasey, Paul (Centre Half)

Another local player who has graduated through the Junior sides. Joined the Club as an amateur in 1949 and became a professional in 1950. A very powerful player, fast and strong, both in attack and defence.

Garvey, Brian (Left Back)

A young local player, he joined the Club as an amateur in 1953 and became a part-time professional in 1957-58 after completing his National Service. Has graduated through the Junior sides. A most promising player, equally at home in any of the half back positions, being very fast and strong in both attack and defence. A player with a very bright future.

Collinson, Leslie (Right Half)
Yet another local player who has graduated through the Junior sides. Quickly gained a position in the senior side after completing his National Service. Tall and strong, he is a most promising young player. Signed professional in 1956 after three years service as an amateur.

McMillan, Eric (Left Half)

Born at Beverley, he was transferred in June 1960 from Chelsea, after having had two and a half seasons with the "Pensioners", whom he joined following trials as an amateur during his National Service. A strong player, he was a regular choice at wing half in the Chelsea Reserve XI, and made 37 first team appearance during last season, for Hull City.

Clark, Douglas (Outside Right)
Joined the Club from Bury in 1955
and quickly became a firm favourite with the "fans". A strong
player, with excellent ball control,
he is very fast and packs a strong
shot. He joined Bury from Darwen
in 1950.

# Supporters' Club Notes

The Committee has recently devoted consideration to the question of the collections at half-time, at First team matches.

It was pointed out that many supporters contribute guite considerably through: (a) increased charges at matches; (b) our own competition; (c) the Directors' Jackpot competition; (d) purchase of programme. Many of the committee felt that the time has now arrived for collections to be discontinued except on special occasions, e.g. to augment Players' Benefit Funds or for charitable purposes.

Against this, however, there is the fact that a considerable sum is still outstanding in respect of the floodlight installation, and it was felt that, while the collections produce even a few pounds per match, as at present, the committee is justified in continuing them, and this was accordingly decided. For the time being, therefore, collections will still be made, and the proceeds will be devoted to the Floodlight Installation Fund, unless otherwise announced.

There are some good supporters, whose views we respect, who prefer not to participate in any of the competitions but who feel justified in contributing a little extra to the Club by means of these collections.

Another good money maker over the years, in an unobtrusive way, has been the cushions. A large stock was purchased in 1937, after the Coronation of King George VI. They have paid for themselves many times over, besides adding to the comfort of many spectators since.

In connection with our own competition we should explain that one of the matches on 2nd September was not played in accordance with the F.A. Handbook, which showed Leyton Orient as a home team, and which was printed as such in our list. Actually the Orient played at Walsall and won; but for the purpose of our competition, the rule applies governing matches not played as printed, and that particular fixture, therefore, had to be regarded as a 3-0 Home win. We trust that this will answer the many questions which have been raised.

Meanwhile, the Directors' own competition is gaining in popularity. We commend it to spectators who may not yet have participated. Tickets are on sale at all entrances.
