

One of the more pleasing aspects of a disappointing start to the current season has been the performance of our Central League side.

Potentially, the reserve string could have been weaker than usual this campaign. There had been a reduction in playing staff, and most important there is no third team through which the players could graduate.

Now the players must step from the Northern Intermediate League side up to the Central League standard.

From eight games the side have collected ten points. Defeats have been handed out to Chesterfield, Bury, Wolves and Liverpool. Oddly enough, seven of these points have come from away visits.

But as a result of this improved form there has been a tendency for the gates to improve. For instance 1,568 people watched the fantastic match with Manchester United who won 11-5 while 1,222 were present for the visit of Liverpool last Saturday.

From the Manager's Office...

Mr. JOHNNY STEELE says -

These have been trying days for us at Oakwell. The end result on Saturday left us at the foot of the Third Division. That is depressing in itself but the means of the defeats have been equally sad.

The form is not just what it should be. We thought that maybe we had overcome our difficulties with the better show at Swindon.

At Swindon there was more life about everything that we did. Maybe we should have finished better but even one point away from home is a good one.

On the other hand down at Bournemouth there can be no excuses for that resounding 5-0 defeat. Midfield we were as good as our opponents but the finishing just was not there. One or two defensive lapses allowed our opponents goals that they should not have had.

Once our opponents got their first two goals the zip and bite seemed to go out of the Barnsley side. There was not the drive which we had seen at Swindon.

But one thing I must stress is that every effort is being made to strengthen the weakness in the team. But it is no easy matter these days signing the type of player we need for the type of money that we are in a position to pay.

Club representatives have been busy in recent weeks checking up on various players who might fill the bill at Oakwell.

Perhaps by tonight's game something will have developed in this line.

Before I sign off, I must refer to the splendid efforts of our Central League side which is often doing a giantkilling act.

Although I am busy with the Third Division side I am hearing reports of the enthusiasm and will to win of these lads.

Swindon Town, with whom we drew 1-1 a week ago at the County Ground, were founded in 1881. It was not, however, until 1894 that they adopted professionalism and joined the newly formed Southern League.

Last season, The Robins as they are nicknamed, finished sixteenth in the Third Division. In the F.A. Cup they were eliminated in the second round by Shrewsbury Town by the only goal of the game.

Local born Ernie Hunt headed Town's league marks-

men with 14 goals in 46 appearances.

When Barnsley and Swindon met last week Frank Bartlett scored for Barnsley and Ralph Hunt for Town.

Goalkeeper SAM BURTON joined the club in 1945 from the County Youth team. He has been the regular first team goalkeeper for several seasons.

KEN JONES, right back, joined the club from Crystal Palace in March of this year. After one game with the reserves be became a first-teamer. JOHN TROLLOPE, left back, is local born, who first joined the club groundstaff.

KEITH MORGAN, right half, an attacking player also joined the club as a youth player from Westbury, while centre half MAURICE OWEN, who has played in several representative games has given great service to the club. Left half BOB WOODRUFF is another local born player who was with Swindon schoolboys.

Outside right MIKE SUMMERBEE, born in Cheltenham is an attraction for other League clubs. He was born in Cheltenham. Inside right ERNIE HUNT played his first League game at 16 years of age.

JACK SMITH, centre forward, was previously with Watford and Hartlepools United, RALPH HUNT inside left is the former Grimsby Town, Portsmouth, Derby County and Norwich marksman while left winger CLIFF JACKSON was born in Swindon. He is a former schoolboy international.


