One thing is certain blame cannot be levelled at Bobby Evans who has tried manfully with what resources he has available and has set a shining example on the field of play. Things may look black at the moment but by no means hopeless and this is the time for supporters to rally round the club and en-

courage the boys to regain their confidence which has been so obviously lacking lately.

Welcome to Brian Walsh, Bob Scott and Wally Hinshelwood and hope they settle down along with the rest of the team. A win today may herald a revival which will take the County up the league and out of danger.—F.G.B.
