

Club Notes

This afternoon we play our second home game in eight weeks. Since defeating Crystal Palace on 23rd December 1961, we have played only one other home match, namely Watford on the 20th January, 1962.

We certainly have been starved as regards Division 3 football. We only hope we can now continue in the normal routine.

The win at Hull on Saturday was most encouraging and very welcome. Two more points and no goals against, a great help to our league position.

The gate was most disappointing, and we received as our share the minimum amount allowed by the League, namely £100. The loss of income, during the past eight weeks, could cause many difficulties for the club. Our main source of revenue is, of course, first-team home games, normally once every two weeks. Therefore one game has to provide sufficient monies to pay all outgoings

for two weeks. A full review of the club's expenditure over the past six months has just been completed and the following table shows the average payments which must be paid each week, irrespective of any income.

CLUB NOTES—continued

Many other payments have to be made in the year, but they are chiefly single payments, whereas the ones quoted above are weekly items. It is obvious therefore, that football does not pay for itself. Without the Supporters' Club weekly competition and other fund raising schemes, the present set-up could not continue.

With all this in mind we welcome the work of the Football League in formulating a new constitution. Whether we agree with all or only some of the proposals, we realise that great efforts have been made to make football more attractive and maintain interest. The introduction of a full-scale League Cup Competition and the back-dating of the F.A. Cup Competition would undoubtedly help in that direction, and of course the "four up and four down" in all leagues. It will be interesting to see how the clubs with voting powers react to these suggestions.

Corby. Signed as amateur immediately after leaving school; as pro. at 17 in 1954. Debut three years later, developing into first choice back in 1960-1.

Foley, Theo (Full Back)
5ft. 10in. 10st. 6lbs. Born Dublin.
Signed this season from Exeter City,
where he was a regular for four
years. Formerly with well-known
Irish club, Home Farm.

Patterson, Ron (Back)
5ft. 11in. 11st. 2lbs. Born Gateshead.
Signed from Middlesbrough in 1952.

Consistent back, he has captained side many times.

Haskins, Tony (Back)
5ft. 9in. 11st. 9lbs. Born Northampton. After period as amateur signed professional in 1959. He has also played as a forward.

Cooke, Barry (Wing-half)
5ft. 7in. 10st. 9lbs. Born Birmingham.
He gained five England youth international caps while at West Brom.,
before joining Northampton in 1959.

Mills, Roland (Wing-half)
5ft. 5in. 10st. 1lb. Born Daventry,
Joined Northampton as amateur in
youth days. Made senior debut in
1954-5. Versatile player who has appeared in various positions.

Branston, T. (Wing or Centre-half) 6ft. 11st. 13lbs. Born Rugby. After developing in Northampton Colts, signed as professional in 1958-9. League debut October 1960. He can also play as back and inside forward.

Carson, Alex (Wing-half)
5ft. 11in. 11st. Born Clarkson, Renfrew. Young player who has developed at Northampton and made League debut in April 1961.

Spelman, Ron (Winger)
5ft. 8in. 11st. 11b. Born Norwich and played with Norwich City until signed by Northampton in November 1960. Possesses considerable speed.

Everitt, Mike (Winger)
5ft, 10in. 11st. Born Clacton and developed on Arsenal ground staff.
Signed for Northampton in February 1961. Can also play wing-half or inside-forward.
