

Managers comments . . .

First, may I extend to all Town supporters the best wishes of the Club, including Directors. Officials and Players, for a Happy Christmas, and

a Bright and Prosperous New Year?

And may I express the hope that the weather will allow us to play our two holiday games with Portsmouth, to-day, and Swindon Town, on Boxing Day? Normally this would be considered a queer sort of wish, but such has been our ill-fortune these last few weeks in the matter of postpone-

ments, that things are now becoming serious.

We have to go back six weeks for our last home League game—the match with Peterborough—for since then we were left with no match, on November 25th, owing to our dismissal from the F.A. Cup, and our home game with Notts County on December 9th had to be postponed owing to snow. Last Saturday we made a fruitless journey to Barnsley, where we were fogged off, and we now find ourselves four or five matches behind most of our Third Division rivals.

All this is a serious matter. It makes things very awkward in a financial sense, for no Club can go on indefinitely without revenue from home

games. Wages have to be found and Club expenses paid.

The other danger is even more serious. These outstanding matches will all have to be played, and there is bound to be a glut of games in the second half of the season. True, this might bring financial benefits to the Club, as we shall be able to play these games in the evening under flood-lights, but there is also the serious risk that injuries might upset our team and cause a loss of league points which we cannot afford to lose.

We can only hope that the weather will treat us more kindly from now on, and that our supporters will not allow this long break without a home

League game to damp their enthusiasm.

OUR VISITORS


