We extend a very warm welcome to all our visitors from Swindon to-night and are looking forward to a really good game.



OUR VISITORS

SWINDON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

To-night we extend a warm welcome to the directors, officials

and players of Swindon Town Football Club.

Formed in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt, they became foundermembers of the Southern League in 1894. In 1900 they fell on very hard times and had to transfer several players many of whom went to our neighbours Nottingham Forest.

However, chiefly by the hard work of Sam Allen they gradually overcame their difficulties and in 1920 they became founder-members of the Football League Division 3. They have spent all

their history in Division 3.

The record gate at the County Ground was set up in 1952 versus Stoke City, when 28,400 were present.

To-day's Personality— MAURICE OWEN

Maurice Owen joined Swindon Town in 1946. After one game in the Colts team he was promoted to the Reserves and quickly proved his worth by scoring four goals in his first outing. His next match was in the First Team at centreforward where he scored a hattrick. From then onwards he was first-choice centre-forward for Swindon.

He continued to be a menace to opposing defences, and also became a target for many transfer offers. Maurice was ever a one-club man and refused to leave Swindon.

He moved to centre-half during season 1959-60 and has continued to play an important part in the fostering of the club's youth policy. His ability has been invaluable in helping and encouraging young players, and he is an outstanding club captain.

PEN PICTURES

BURTON, Sam (goalkeeper). Signed for Swindon in 1945 from the successful County Youth team. Has been the established First Team goalkeeper for several seasons.

TROLLOPE, John (left-back). A local boy who joined Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team when he was sixteen years old.

WOLLEN, Terry (right-back). Another local boy who made his debut for the First Team when sixteen years old. He played the majority of First Team games during season 1960-61.

MORGAN, Keith (right-half). A strong, attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Played in every First Team game during 1960-61.

HUNT, Ernie. (inside-right). A member of the First Team at sixteen years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the club has had many offers. Was top goal-scorer 1960-61.

SUMMERBEE, Mike (outside-right). Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Another of the players wanted by several clubs.

WOODRUFF, Bob (wing-half). Another local-born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. Was an ever-present for the club season 1960-61.

DARCY, Arnold (outside-left). Joined the club in November 1956 from Wigan Athletic. In spite of his lack of inches he is a strong forceful winger with a powerful shot.

ATKINS, Bill (inside-forward). At present in the services, he joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of the 1958-59 season. A strong ball-playing forward.

SMITH, Jack (centre-forward). Joined the Robins from Watford during the close season. He was formerly with Hartlepools United. A strong, forceful player with the ability to get the expected goal.


