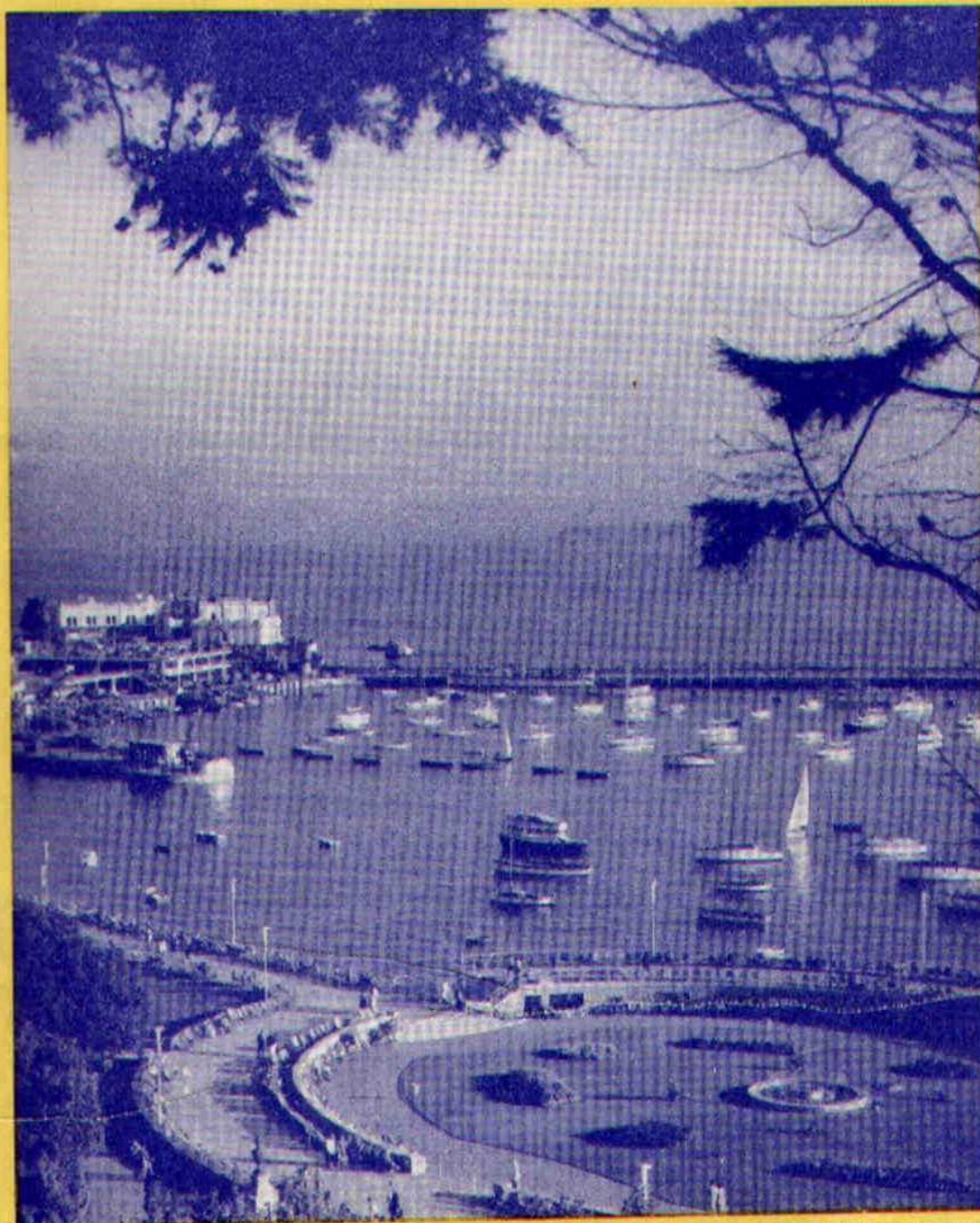

Today's visitors, Swindon Town, are, of course managed by Bert Head, that former great stalwart for United. I understand that one of his assistants these days is Jack Conley, whose brilliant headers will long be remembered here.

Here are some details of the players from whom to-day's side will be selected :

Goalkeeper, Mike O'Hara, was transferred from Luton Town in November, 1961, and has since played regularly for the first team.

Full-backs : Terry Wollen is a local boy who made his debut for the first team when he was sixteen years old. In Season 1960-61 he played in most of the first team games but was later displaced by Ken Jones. John Trollope is another local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. He was selected for the first team at the beginning of Season 1960-61 when he was 16 and was ever present that term.

He has played several representative matches while in the Army.

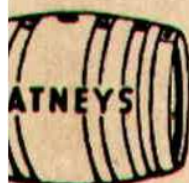

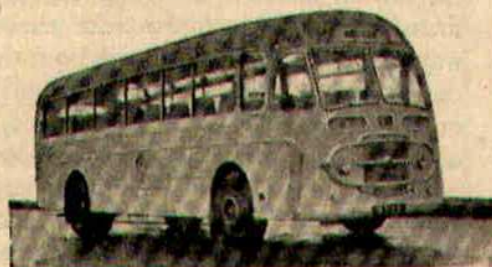
