their tickets. Truly real and loyal support, and, we venture to hope, faith in the present policy — namely, the producing and retaining of our own players. Thank you, ladies and gentlemen! The money received from the sale of season tickets is most helpful as during the summer months the revenue of the Club is very small.

To date we have sold 864 season tickets for £4,056, compared with 896 and £4,208 last season.

When the two teams met at Swindon last year the result was a 2-2 draw. Our goals were scored by Atkins and Smith.






