

the unhappy memory of last Saturday's game.

We heard a novel suggestion for the elimination of the congested fixture list caused by the League Cup.

The proposer advocated that this competition should commence immediately after the First Round proper of the F.A. Cup.

Clubs defeated in the latter competition would then commence to participate in the League Cup, and other League clubs would not be required to do so until they had been knocked out of the F.A. Cup. They would therefore gain byes in the League Cup, equivalent in number to the rounds in which they play in the F.A. Cup, and would therefore profit by exemption in the League Cup to the extent of their success in the more popular competition.

This would have the advantage of

(1) reducing the number of overall matches played, and eliminating the early season congestion of fixtures;

(2) providing a new interest for clubs losing in the early

rounds of the F.A. Cup;

Jaken and the

(3) making it possible for clubs whose opponents are playing in the F.A. Cup to provide a fixture for their supporters, to replace a postponed League match on a Saturday;

(4) possibly providing an inducement for some of the Division I clubs not at present participating in the

League Cup Competition, to do so.

No doubt there would be some technical points to be ironed out, but the suggestion seems to be worthy of consideration.






