It will be our third visit to Bristol Rovers this season, having met them in the League Cup and then in the League, now in the F.A. Cup. Having lost and drawn there let's hope the third time is lucky and we bring off a win. Incidentally we have had notification from Bristol that tickets for our Cup Tie with Bristol Rovers are available on application to the Secretary, Bristol Rovers F.C., Eastville, Bristol. The prices are as follows:—North Stand—7/6, Children 4/-; South Stand—6/6, Children 3/6.

To-day against Swindon Town we must stop the rot that has set in our League effort. Not a win from our last six matches and only three points out of a possible twelve is definitely not good enough. In some of the past few matches we have been perhaps unlucky in the respect that we have had most of the play and dropped points but in others, for instance the Brighton game at home, there has been no excuse, it was just bad play and lack of 100% effort. The time has come for an all-out effort because a few wins on the trot can still put us among the leaders and to-day's game must be the start of that ascension.

The injuries position has been causing a lot of concern but to-day I am pleased to say it has resolved itself somewhat in that we have both Arthur Longbottom and Stan Edwards on the field of play once more.

Every effort is being made to strengthen our playing staff and approaches have been made for players of the ability and personality we feel is necessary, but at the time of writing we have met with no success, this I can assure you has been very disappointing to us but we shall keep trying!

SWINDON TOWN came into being as a professional club in 1894. They were one of the original members of the Southern League and played a prominent part in that competition until the formation of the Third Division by the Football League.

The "Robins" have been members of the Third Division ever since and have had to seek re-election on three occasions. On the credit side they have been semi-finalists of the F.A. Sup in 1910 and 1912; and quarter finalists twice.

Swindon finished in fourth position in the Third Division South on four occasions, the last being in 1957 - 58 when they secured 57 points. 1958 - 59 found them in fifteenth position in the new Third Division with 45 points. The following season Swindon finished just below us on goal average. They secured 46 points, scoring 69 goals against 78.

In 1960 - 61 they fielded one of the youngest sides in league football. On occasions there were five 17-year-olds in the team, and the club got off to a promising start. Their hopes gradually faded however, between October and February, during which only one league game was won, but eventually the position eased and their final placing in the league table was the same as the previous season, i.e. 16th with 43 points.

Last season was a good one for the Club finished in ninth position with 49 points. Only a preponderance of drawn games, fifteen, prevented them from occupying a higher place — one of the drawn matches was at Vale Park where each side scored once.

The Club's best goal-scoring season was 1926 - 27 when they Scored 100 goals in 42 matches, and 47 of them were scored by D. Morris who was then top scorer in the Division.

The Club has provided several International players in its time, notably in latter years, N. Uprichard, who played for Ireland.


