

cedented demand for season tickets, tip-up seats have been placed in both ends of the old stand. Another innovation is the placing of seats around the playing area. This is very much an experiment. How long the seats remain in that position depends upon (a) the demand, at enclosure prices; and (b) the reaction and behaviour of the occupants. Supporters who sit in the seats are specially requested not to move until the final whistle. Older supporters will remember that earlier seats placed around the ground were removed chiefly because of incidents occurring after a match.

Regarding the proposed new stand, plans are still being discussed, regarding type and siting of the building.

The Town Council (our landlords) have shown great interest, and have been most helpful. They, through the Borough Surveyor, hope to see erected at the County Ground a stand unique in English football, one of outstanding design and structure. May all our hopes be realised.

Meanwhile, the great need at the moment is more and better accommodation for spectators, thus providing more revenue for the Club.

Other amenities will have to be added, which unfortunately will not increase space or money.

Details of the players from whom the team will be selected are as

follows:-

JONES, KEN (Goalkeeper)

A native of South Wales, and a former Welsh Under-23 International. Joined Scunthorpe in 1958-59 season from Cardiff City, and is reckoned one of the best goalkeepers in the Second Division.

REEVES, BRIAN (Goalkeeper)

In his second full season with Scunthorpe and played really well when drafted into the senior side at the end of last season. A Lancashire lad, he joined Scunthorpe from Blackburn Rovers and has made rapid improvement towards the top grade.

BROWNSWORD, JACK (Full Back)

Scunthorpe's veteran full back, having joined the club from Frickley Coliery, while United were in the Midland League. Has a fine record as a player, and is the team's penalty expert. Had a short spell with Hull City before going non league with Frickley. A native of Bentley, near Doncaster, and a former collier.

HORSTEAD, BARRY (Full Back)

Another long service player, who joined Scunthorpe from Brigg Town. Was originally a wing-half but has also played well at centre half. Born at Brigg, but Scunthorpe is his only league club. Strong full back, and full of courage.

HEMSTEAD, DEREK (Full Back)

Joined Scunthorpe straight from a local school, and has worked his way through the junior teams. Has made several first team appearances in the last two seasons, and is a full back of real promise. Born in Scunthorpe.

GIBSON, ARCHIE (Wing Half)

Joined Scunthorpe for a fee from Leeds United, and now starting his fourth season with the club. Has been club captain for the past three seasons. A Scotsman, who plays a calm game and is rarely rattled.

GANNON, MIKE (Wing Half)

Joined Scunthorpe from Everton at the start of last season as a full back, but could not settle. Was moved to wing half, and made such improvement that he was back in the senior side at the end of the season. A native of Liverpool.

Joined Scunthorpe for their first season in the Second Division in 1958 as an inside forward from Oldham Athletic. From there was switched to wing half, and later to centre half, where he has made his name. Fearless, and a fine header of the ball. Born in Derbyshire.

PASSMOOR, TOM (Centre Half)

Joined Scunthorpe five years ago from South Shields, but was previously with Sunderland. A strong player, who has stepped into the first team as deputy for Neale and played some outstanding games.

MARRIOTT, JACK (Wing Forward)

Started as a professional with Scunthorpe, and moved from them to Sheffield Wednesday, returning to Scunthorpe via Huddersfield Town. Can play on either wing, and a most experienced wing forward. Born at Scunthorpe.

WILSON, ANDY (Wing Forward)


Joined Scunthorpe from Sheffield United three years ago, and has played well in both wing positions. Very fast, and clever on the ball. A native of Rotherham.

LINDSEY, BARRY (Inside Forward)

CRAWFORD, IAN (Wing Forward)

Signed just before last season's transfer dead-line for a big fee from West Ham. Yet another Scot, who has quickly settled down at Scunthorpe. Like Brownsword, is a qualified F.A. coach. Before joining West Ham was with Hearts. Edinburgh born.

CLOSE SEASON SIGNINGS

HUTTON, **JOHN** (Wing or Inside Forward)

Signed in face of stiff competition from the Scottish club Hamilton Academicals. Big things are expected of this young player, who made a big mark in the Scottish Second Division last season.

LAWTHER, IAN (Centre Forward)

Signed during the close season from Blackburn Rovers at a club record transfer fee. Formerly played with Sunderland. The only Irish born player on the staff and the holder of several international caps.

SMILLIE, ANDREW (Inside Forward)

Born Isle of Sheppey. Another close season signing from Crystal Palace. He previously played with West Ham United. A good ball player and the holder of a number of Youth International caps.

MAHY, BARRY (Inside Forward)

Signed from the Channel Islands club, Northerners A.C. of Guernsey, after impressing in an inter-islands match. Has been a prominent Channel Islands player, from the same district as Nottingham Forest's winger Le Flem. Born in Doncaster, and married to a Leeds girl. Signed after a Scunthorpe trial, with a generous donation given to his former club.
