Happily the news of the youngster is entirely satisfactory. It now becomes purely a matter of patience. In the ordinary way a man with a broken leg can expect to have the cast off after the maximum of a couple of months.

Naturally footballers are treated with additional caution. Colin must not expect to be playing again this season, more's the pity.

A very good cricketer who has played with the Durham County team, he will, we hope, get lots of opportunity to strengthen the leg during the summer ready for the new season.

Lately they have lost a little of the pace of their early triumphs—during which they tasted the leadership of the section. They remain an eminently successful young team.

To a large extent they are similar in dedication and composition to our own side—well discovered youngsters with a thread of experience. Bert Head the man in charge has done a fine job. They are most welcome here this afternoon.

By defeating Northampton in the return holiday game we moved into the top half of the table for the first time this season. In going there our players drew their first slice of the new incentive scales which are related to accomplishment.

Here's hoping that in this first League game of the New Year there is more in store for them . . . !
