

## **OUR VISITORS**

Although they have not been playing quite so well recently as in the early part of the season, Swindon Town, who will be paying their first League visit to Roker Park today, may well prove a more formidable team to beat than might appear. If, as we hope, our players take both points, then the reckoning between the Wiltshire side and ourselves will be level, for they defeated us by the only goal in September.

Those people who expressed doubts that Swindon would make much impact in the Second Division, to which they won promotion at the end of last season, were quickly forced to revise their opinion. Swindon's first six matches of the current campaign ended in victory, and two draws and another win—that against us—followed before they had to admit defeat at Northampton, with whom they were promoted, in their tenth engagement to prove that this setback was only temporary, Swindon proceeded to take seven points from their next five League fixtures, by which time they shared the leadership with ourselves and Leeds United, all with 23 points.

The visit of Southampton to the County Ground on November 2, saw Swindon suffer their only home defeat of the season to date, the Saints winning by the odd goal of three. That game marked the start of the Wiltshire side's decline from their previous very high standard. They have played eleven subsequent League matches, of which they have drawn six and lost four and won only one.

Without paying big fees in the transfer market, Swindon manager Bert Head has gradually built up a first-class side, with a large proportion of local products. There are eight players who were born in Swindon or in the immediate neighbourhood on the club's payroll, six of whom have been regulars in the senior side.

These are left-back Norman Trollope, wing-halves Keith Morgan and Bob Woodruff, inside-forwards Ernie Hunt and Roger Smart and left-winger Don Rogers. In addition goalkeeper Mike Turner and outside-right Mike Summerbee have also been developed by the club from its junior ranks, though they were not born locally.

Manager Head has been so satisfied with his defence that the only changes made in it have been at right-back, where Owen Dawson and Terry Wollen have both appeared. Dawson has been the usual choice, Wollen, another local product, having played in only three matches. He took over when Dawson dropped out through injury at the end of November, these being Wollen's first League games since breaking a leg in December, 1962.

Swindon's experienced centre-half Ken McPherson will not be far from home this afternoon, for he is a native of West Hartlepool. Formerly a centre-forward, he played for Notts County, Middlesbrough, Coventry City and Newport County before joining Swindon in 1960. He has not missed a single League engagement this winter.

With the front line not scoring with its former frequency in recent weeks, there have been several alterations involving the three inside positions, but wingers Mike Summerbee and Don Rogers are both ever-presents. Ernie Hunt returned at inside-right a fortnight ago after missing two games through i'lness, thus allowing Roger

Smart to take over the leadership of the attack from John Stevens. Shortly before Christmas, Stevens had himself replaced Jack Smith at centre-forward.

Smith, who like McPherson, comes from West Hartlepool, recently left the Wiltshire club, signing for Brighton on January 6.

Completing the attack in the last few games has been Bill Atkins, who has alternated between both inside-forward positions. His most recent outings have been at inside-left, however,.

Ernie Hunt is the side's leading marksman with ten League goals, followed by Mike Summerbee and Bill Atkins, who have each scored six. Don Rogers has four goals to his credit and Roger Smart three in League games. Jack Smith has netted five times in 20 Second Division appearances before his transfer last month.

Swindon's full away record shows three wins and four draws in 13 fixtures. Their victories have been at Grimsby 2-1, Portsmouth 4-1, and Plymouth 4-2, with draws at Leeds, Manchester City and Rotherham all 0-0 and Middlesbrough 1-1. They have lost at Northampton 0-4, Huddersfield 0-2, Preston 0-1, Swansea and Scunthorpe both 0-3 and Norwich 2-3.

Last week they visited Aldershot in the fourth round of the F.A. Cup and won 2-1.



### PEN PICTURES of SWINDON TOWN

Mike Turner, goalkeeper. Just demobbed from the R.A.F. he joined the club while still in the services from Dorchester Town. Took over in goal following the injury to O'Hara last season and is expected to make strong bids for the first-team position this season.

Owen Dawson, right-back. Signed during the close season from Portsmouth. Was a former youth international and is expected to challenge for first-team honours this season.

John Trollope, left-back. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the season 1960-61, when he was 16 and was ever-present during that season and last season.

Keith Morgan, right-half. A strong, attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Played in every first team game during 1960-61 and missed only three games last year through injury.

Ken McPherson, centre-half. Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward, he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

Bob Woodruff, left-half. Another local born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. Has played at centre-forward and inside-forward in the senior side and his performances have made him a target for several transfer offers. Mike Summerbee, outside-right. Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own. Another of the players wanted by several clubs.

Ernie Hunt, inside-right. Joined the club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960-61 and again last year.

Roger Smart, centre-forward. Another local born player who joined the club direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the reserve team his own. Converted to a wing-half, he made four first team appearances last season, but is now back leading the attack.

Bill Atkins, inside-left. Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of the 1958-59 season. A strong ball playing forward. Was demobbed mid-way through last season and quickly made the inside-left position his own.

Don Rogers, outside-left. One of the brightest new-comers from from Swindon's youth development scheme. Scored two goals in seven appearances last season, but has now settled down as a cultured winger with a great future. An ever-present this season, he has scored four goals so far.
