Footballer of the Year By HARRY DITTON, (News of the World)

Time marches on and all too soon for most of us the day of reckoning so far as season 1963-64 is concerned will be with us. By and large the reckoning is based on goals scored and conceded, of points won and lost, of honours gained and status surrendered.

But we members of the Fourth Estate—sports journalists to you—annually make one calculation which is not necessarily based on any of these things. I refer to the statuette

awarded to the Footballer of the Year.

Invariably, and perhaps inevitably, when the reckoning is made we find the field of selection a comparatively narrow one. For instance a player from the Third or Fourth Division has yet to be honoured. More remarkable still, unless my memory faulters, no player who could be said to have graduated with a club in one of the lower divisions has been chosen.

Selection has always favoured, if that is the right word, a player from the First or Second Division whose club has hit the high spots. Getting to Wembley has always been a good passport. Indeed of the 13 players who have received the attractive statuette in the past 16 seasons—Stanley Matthews, Tommy Finney and Danny Blanchflower have all won it twice—no fewer than 10 have won it in seasons when their clubs have reached the Cup Final.

If there is a criticism of the voting that results in the granting of this award you may well think this is it and I would not disagree with you . . . at least not violently. It's always a tremendous achievement, of course, to get to Wembley but this "death or glory" tournament is not, in my opinion, to be compared as a test of skill, with the winning of the League Championship or gaining promotion from the Second Division to the First.

After all the F.A. tournament embraces only six games, excluding replays, and extends over only half the season. It is possible for a player to hit his top form in Cup ties and miss half his clubs League games yet get away with the Footballer of the Year statuette. It

really has happened but no names no pack drill.

All I hope is that it won't happen again this season . . . or ever again . . . but I do hope that this time a graduate from the Third Division may receive the honour. I'll put it no higher than to say he must be greatly fancied. Have you guessed to whom I refer?

The player is Charlie Hurley, the Sunderland centre half, who considering how prices

have soared in recent years was a gift from Millwall at £18,000.

Whether 70 of my Press colleagues think the same as I do or not there cannot be a doubt in anyone's mind Hurley is a worthy candidate, or should I say challenger. Not only is he a model player on the field and off but I rate him the best centre half in the Football League and, possibly, in the world. What's more he has been for at least three seasons.

He is in the Neil Franklin, Stan Cullis class of by-gone days and there can be no higher compliment than this. It's just bad luck on England that this quiet and modest lad with a rich Cockney accent who learned his football at Millwall—Sunderland have merely put a little extra polish on him—was born in Eire.


