## CLUB NOTES

After an absence of many years Swindon Town are our welcome visitors to Ninian Park this afternoon.

The last time the sides met was in the F.A. Cup Competition when we were held to a draw, 1-1 at Ninian Park. Swindon won the replay at the County ground by a goal to nil. Maurice Owen the Swindon Centre-forward scoring the winner in extra time. George Edwards the present City director had a goal disallowed just previously which looked a perfectly good goal but the referee thought otherwise.

The present Swindon Side now managed by Bert Head the old Torquay Centre-half back are a youthful team composed mainly of youngsters who have graduated to the senior ranks from the Swindon youth eleven. Last season Swindon gained promotion to Division two and this season at the end of September were riding high at the top of the League Table with 16 points from 10 games. The Railwaymen however have been unable to maintain this form. Nevertheless they hold a comfortable position in the top half of the table.

Notes for this match had of necessity to be written before the result of either the Swindon away game on Good Friday and Saturdays game against Swansea. We sincerely hope that the results of both these matches have been favourable to us.

The City players are going to have a busy time until the end of the season at the end of to-days game they will have played 4 matches in 6 days, including the

replayed Semi-Final of the Welsh Cup with Newport County.

The League game with Leyton Orient postponed from October 12th because of the Wales v. England International has now been arranged for Monday, April 13th.

The Grimsby match put off a fortnight ago owing to the waterlogged pitch has yet to be arranged.

Next Saturday Derby County are the visitors to Ninian Park and on Wednesday, April 8th, K.O. 7.15 p.m. Scunthorpe will be at Ninian Park.

### PEN PICTURES OF THE SWINDON TOWN PLAYERS

**MIKE TURNER, (Goalkeeper)**—Just demobbed from the R.A.F. he joined the Club whilst still in the services from Dorchester Town. Took over in goal following the injury to O'Hara last season and is expected to make strong bids for the first-team position this season.

**OWEN DAWSON, (Full back or Centre forward)**—Signed during the close season from Portsmouth. Was a former Youth International and is expected to challenge for first team honours this season.

**JOHN TROLLOPE, (Left back)**—A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960/61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and last season. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962/63.

**KEITH MORGAN, (Right half)**—Team Captain. A strong, attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a Youth player from Westbury. Played in every first team game during 1960/61 season and missed only three games last year through injury. Made maximum appearances during 1962/63.

**TOM HALLETT, (Centre half or Left half)**—Close season signing from Leeds United. Fast and tenacious player. Age 24.

**ROGER SMART, (Wing half)**—Another local born player who joined the club direct from the Swindon schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the Centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own. More recently converted to a wing-half, he made four first team appearances last season.

**MIKE SUMMERBEE, (Outside right)**—Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at Centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own. Another of the players wanted by several clubs.

**ERNIE HUNT, (Inside right)**—Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the First team at 16 years of age, he is a player of outstanding ability, for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal-scorer 1960/61 and 1961/62. Capped for England Under 23's during 1962/63.

**JOHN STEVENS, (Centre forward)**—An amateur player. Was a regular in the promotion side last season. Scored seven times in fourteen appearances. Age 21.

**BILL ATKINS, (Inside forward)**—Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of the 1958/59 Season. A strong ball playing forward. He played several representative matches while in the Army. Was demobbed mid-way through last season and quickly made the inside-left position his own.

**GRAHAM FRENCH, (Left wing)**—Close season signing from Shrewsbury Town. Gained his Youth International Cap for the very successful England Youth side last season. He is a fast, elusive player. Age 18.

**KEN McPHERSON, (Centre half)**—Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

## Footballer of the Year By HARRY DITTON, (*News of the World*)

Time marches on and all too soon for most of us the day of reckoning so far as season 1963-64 is concerned will be with us. By and large the reckoning is based on goals scored and conceded, of points won and lost, of honours gained and status surrendered.

But we members of the Fourth Estate—sports journalists to you—annually make one calculation which is not necessarily based on any of these things. I refer to the statuette awarded to the Footballer of the Year.

Invariably, and perhaps inevitably, when the reckoning is made we find the field of selection a comparatively narrow one. For instance a player from the Third or Fourth Division has yet to be honoured. More remarkable still, unless my memory falters, no player who could be said to have graduated with a club in one of the lower divisions has been chosen.

Selection has always favoured, if that is the right word, a player from the First or Second Division whose club has hit the high spots. Getting to Wembley has always been a good passport. Indeed of the 13 players who have received the attractive statuette in the past 16 seasons—Stanley Matthews, Tommy Finney and Danny Blanchflower have all won it twice—no fewer than 10 have won it in seasons when their clubs have reached the Cup Final.

If there is a criticism of the voting that results in the granting of this award you may well think this is it and I would not disagree with you . . . at least not violently. It's always a tremendous achievement, of course, to get to Wembley but this "death or glory" tournament is not, in my opinion, to be compared as a test of skill, with the winning of the League Championship or gaining promotion from the Second Division to the First.

After all the F.A. tournament embraces only six games, excluding replays, and extends over only half the season. It is possible for a player to hit his top form in Cup ties and miss half his clubs League games yet get away with the Footballer of the Year statuette. It really has happened but no names no pack drill.

All I hope is that it won't happen again this season . . . or ever again . . . but I do hope that this time a graduate from the Third Division may receive the honour. I'll put it no higher than to say he must be greatly fancied. Have you guessed to whom I refer?

The player is Charlie Hurley, the Sunderland centre half, who considering how prices have soared in recent years was a gift from Millwall at £18,000.

Whether 70 of my Press colleagues think the same as I do or not there cannot be a doubt in anyone's mind Hurley is a worthy candidate, or should I say challenger. Not only is he a model player on the field and off but I rate him the best centre half in the Football League and, possibly, in the world. What's more he has been for at least three seasons.

He is in the Neil Franklin, Stan Cullis class of by-gone days and there can be no higher compliment than this. It's just bad luck on England that this quiet and modest lad with a rich Cockney accent who learned his football at Millwall—Sunderland have merely put a little extra polish on him—was born in Eire.

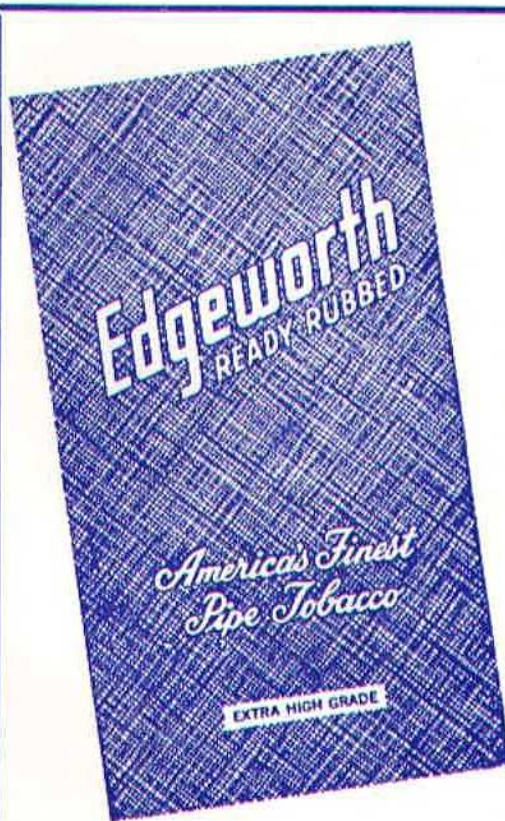
