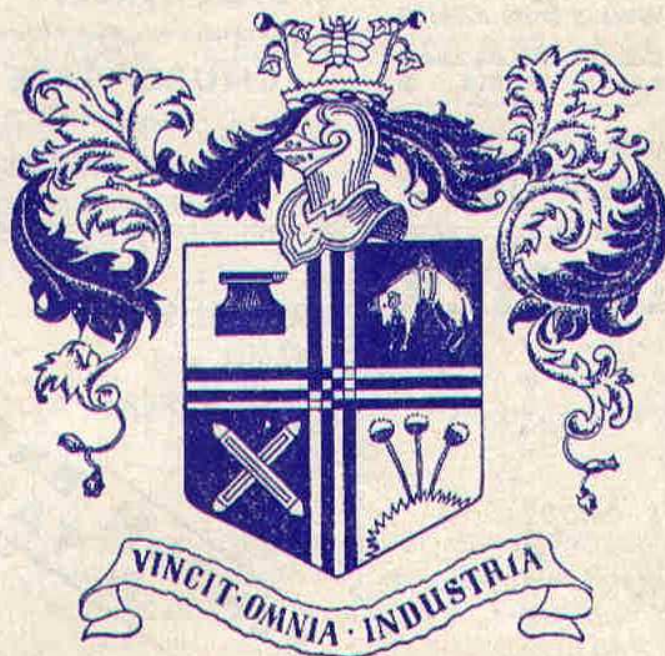

# BURY v SWINDON T.

## GIGG LANE GLEANINGS

EVERY season for every club is always, in prospect at least, going to be among the most successful. If it were not so, if officials and players were not convinced that the best is yet to be the outlook would indeed be depressing. And that is certainly not the mood at Gigg Lane as we welcome the 1964-65 season which starts this afternoon. We realise a big task faces the Club but we hope and think the playing record will be much brighter than it was a year ago. Then we began promisingly, slumped into ordinariness, and then in the crucial final phase established a safe position. We must strive this season to avoid the worrying phase which struck the Club after the turn of the year.

We extend a cordial greeting to all our supporters and hope they come along in greater numbers than last winter. We will do all we can to earn their confidence and to make their journeys to Gigg Lane really necessary! No-one can predict the outcome of any campaign, but we can at least declare that the officials and the players will do all they can within the resources available to create a match-winning side playing entertaining football. In this the sporting public will have to play its part. Only when a co-operative partnership is struck is full success possible. The Club will do all it can to ensure this being achieved.

Though there has been little change in the playing staff from last season major alterations have taken place on the executive side. The first adjustment was the appointment last May of Mr. Bob Stokoe as manager of the Club. Bob had given us great service as player and team manager, and his step up the ladder was his proper reward. May he have a most successful career in what can be a most exacting and yet rewarding job. Then at the meeting of the directors on Tuesday Alderman S. Lord took over the chairmanship of the Club from Mr. G. B. Horridge, who at the annual meeting of shareholders in July had indicated he would not seek re-election to the office. In recognition of Mr. Horridge's great service—he has been a director since 1930 and chairman nineteen times—he was elected life president of the Club, a position previously held by Mr. Herbert Duckworth. Vice-chairman will be Mr. Fred Taylor.

This afternoon we welcome Swindon Town and Mr. Bert Head their manager, knowing that the Wiltshire side will provide us with a very severe test. They made a great effort last winter, but did not stay the pace, largely due to injuries. Bert, our former captain and chief scout, has built a side of experience and eager youth, a mixture which is always likely to do well. We couldn't have wished for a sterner test as a curtain raiser.

Goal: **Norman Oakley**—Born Norton-on-Tees. Joined the club from Hartlepoons United in March, 1964.

Right Back: **Terry Wollen**—Born Swindon. Another local boy who made his debut for the first team when 16 years old. He played the majority of first team games during season 1960-61.

Left Back: **John Trollope**—A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of season 1960-61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961-62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962-63-64.

Full Back: **Owen Dawson**—Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth, June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

Right half: **Keith Morgan**—Born Trowbridge. Team Captain. A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962-3-4.

Centre half or Left half: **Tom Hallett**—Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United July, 1963. Fast and tenacious player.

Centre half: **Ken McPherson**—Born West Hartlepool. Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

Inside forward: **Bill Atkins**—Born Solihull. Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of 1958-59 season. A strong, ball-playing forward. He took part in several representative matches while in the Army. Since his demob, has made the inside left position his own.

Forward: **Frank Large**—Born Leeds. Signed from Northampton March, 1964. A very strong forceful player.

Forward: **Donald Rogers**—Born Paulton. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.

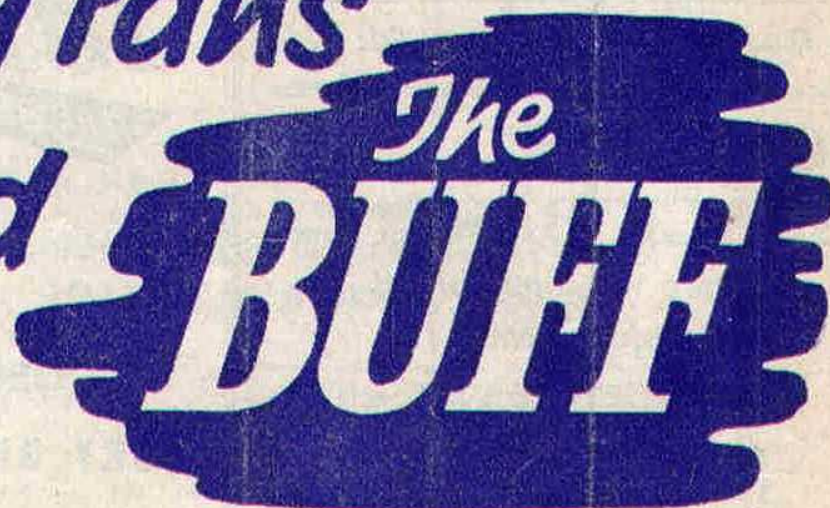
