

Thus from being right on top, we slumped almost to rock bottom. The effect on the team was very obvious. For a little while the incidents seemed to take all the fight out of the lads. Before they could recover their breath (so to speak), Bury had taken every advantage of the position and scored three more quick goals. The interval was used to work out some form of plan, and to restore confidence to the team. In the second half our lads quite held their own, and were very unfortunate to concede two more goals (especially as one was an own goal).

As we said earlier, such is football and the luck of the game. In the past such happenings have often been in our favour.

The match does, however, raise once again the question of substitutes. On this occasion it was the goalkeeper (a key position), one which more than any other demands an expert. Whilst generally we are not in favour of substitution, we do feel that in the case of the goalkeeper the rule could be altered for a replacement up to half-time, but only in the case of serious injury.

The game at Bury was, in the main, completely spoiled from the spectators' point of view. In the first half, one team was very much on top, and in the second half it was merely defensive tactics to help to keep down the score. Obviously, not a very entertaining match to watch.

The Reserve game at the County Ground was rather disappointing, but we trust supporters will bear with us. The Combination is the training ground for our young players. To enable them to develop, they must play against better opposition than themselves. We feel there is much potential in the Reserve team which must be brought out. With the exception of one player — centre-half T. Hallett — all our lads were under twenty years of age, several being barely eighteen. We
