Hardaker, Secretary of the Football League. I'm afraid at the moment our lads seem to play better away from home. Incidentally, both teams were marked 80% for sportsmanship and fair play. They earned those markings, for it was a splendid clean game, with only about two fouls throughout the ninety minutes. To date Swindon must rate quite high in their total. Well done, lads! Keep up this good reputation.

With the results not quite so good as last year, some of our supporters tend to become somewhat impatient, wanting quick improvement. All this talk of buying players, to strengthen certain positions, creates a detrimental effect upon our lads. They give everything they have, and will undoubtedly return to form, given the right encouragement.
