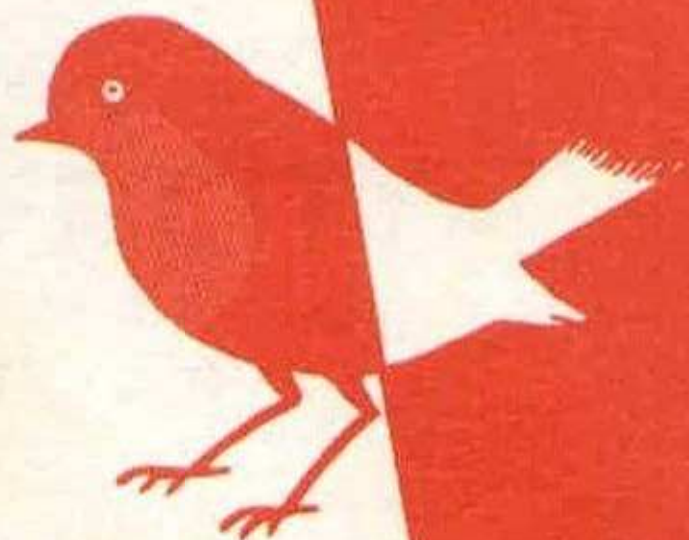

CLUB NOTES

Two games played and two points obtained, but what splendid matches! Those supporters who travelled to Coventry no doubt enjoyed the game. Excellent football by both teams, with the result always in the balance. Unfortunately, when the final whistle went, Swindon's score was just on the debit side. Nevertheless, a great game and obviously we should have enjoyed it just that little bit more had we obtained at least one point.

Then on Tuesday, the stirring game against Southampton, played before the biggest gate of the season, 19,300. Southampton supporters probably numbered between three and four thousand. A very hard-fought game, with many knocks given and taken. Whilst we did not see the sweet-flowing, academic football like that displayed in the Derby County game, it was thrilling stuff, made more exciting from our point of view because, once again, our lads came from behind to win.

The injury to Knapp, the visiting centre-half, probably affected the game, but Southampton's team was mainly composed of strong virile players of many years' experience. This defeat ended a very successful run, since the first fortnight of the season, and also stopped the practice of Southampton winning at Swindon, as they have done on the last six previous occasions.

TWO MINUTES FROM GROUND

CLUB NOTES—continued

Today we are pleased to welcome a fine club and the pride of Wales, Cardiff City. There has always existed a certain friendly rivalry between the two clubs, something which probably sprung from the fact that in 1910, when the present name was adopted and the club became a professional one, Swindon played an exhibition game to open Ninian Park.

Since that date, Cardiff has enjoyed much success, having spent long spells in Division I, being level top in Season 1923-24. They also won the F.A. Cup in Season 1926-27.

Games between the two clubs have been very keen and usually very close. The two most outstanding in present memories are the cup-battles of Season 1951-52. That year Swindon played nine cup games: Bedford Town (home) in the first round, three matches versus Torquay, to finally win 3-1 at Bristol; then followed the two matches against Cardiff, the first on the Saturday, score 1-1. There were possibly more Swindon supporters at the game than those of the home team. In the replay on the following Wednesday, before a full house, Swindon won 1-0, Maurice Owen scoring the only goal. In the next round, Swindon drew at home 1-1 with Stoke City, but won the replay 1-0, Willie Millar being the scorer. Finally, we lost at Luton 1-3. Mike Betteridge scored Swindon's goal, the first in the game. Swindon's team was: Uprichard; Hunt, May; Kaye, Hudson, Gray; Lunn, Onslow, Owen, Betteridge, Bain; Millar substituting for the injured Roy Onslow at Stoke.

Over the years, Cardiff has had many great players. The famous names that come to mind are Fred Keenor, Jack Nelson, Len Davies, Frank Moss, Alf Sherwood, Trevor Ford, Ray Daniel and George Edwards. The last-named played against us in the cup-tie, and is a very strong member of the City Board of Directors.

This afternoon we welcome the Directors, Officials and Players of Cardiff City Football Club to the County Ground. The City are having a very indifferent season and will be anxious to gain the points for today's game.

Details of the players from whom today's team will be selected are as follows:—

WILSON, ROBERT (Goalkeeper)

Signed by Cardiff from Aston Villa in August 1964, for £6000, this 6ft. 1in. goalkeeper possesses tremendous agility and a fine sense of positional play. Born Birmingham and is 21 years old.

JOHN, DILWYN (Goalkeeper)

A product of Cardiff Schools Football, playing for Radnor Road and Cardiff Boys. Made numerous appearances in the senior side last season.

RODRIGUES, PETER (Full Back)

Cardiff-born, joined City after being spotted playing in Cardiff Schools Football. A tenacious tackler and quick on recovery, he played for the Welsh Under-23 Eleven against England at Bristol last season.

MILNE, ALEC (Full Back)

Signed by Cardiff from Arbroath in 1957. Now fully recovered from his broken ankle which kept him out of action for all of last season. A former Scottish Under-23 Cap.

PECK, TREVOR (Full Back)

Born Pontyates, Carmarthenshire, joined Cardiff from Llanelli in Season 1959-60 as a centre half, now converted to full back. A strong player and a keen tackler. Has been unfortunate in sustaining injuries, but is now completely fit.

CHARLES, JOHN (Centre Half)

One of the greatest all round footballers in the world. Big John started his career with Leeds United then transferred to Juventus and after being brought back by Leeds, he returned to Italy. Signed by Cardiff from Roma in Season 1963-64, he is their team Captain. Holder of 37 International Caps.

WILLIAMS, GARETH (Wing Half)

Born at Fleur-de-Lys, Monmouthshire, he joined the professional staff in 1961, and made several appearances in the senior side last season. A strong and determined player with a powerful shot.

OUR VISITORS—continued

BAKER, COLIN (Full Back or Wing Half)

Born in Cardiff. One of Cardiff's local products who succeeded an equally famous international namesake (Billy Baker) when he made his debut in 1953. Capped for Wales since 1959, he has played twice for Wales Under-23 Eleven.

HOLE, BARRY (Half Back)

Son of former Swansea Town and Welsh International Billy Hole, he is a product of Swansea. Joined Cardiff in 1960. A clever ball player, he is a Welsh International.

ALLCHURCH, IVOR (Inside Left)

When he played his 49th game for Wales in 1962 he broke the record set up by the late Billy Meredith. Eleven years with Swansea Town, his home club, he was transferred to Newcastle United in October, 1958. Signed by Cardiff in the summer of 1962. A brilliant schemer and controller of the ball, he is invariably among the goals.

KING, PETER (Inside Forward or Wingman)

Born at Worcester he came to Cardiff from Worcester City in 1961. Can play on either wing or in the inside positions. A speedy attacker and tireless worker.

CHARLES, MEL (Centre Forward)

Charles made his name with Swansea Town, from where he was transferred to Arsenal in April 1959, for £40,000. He moved to Cardiff in February, 1962, and has played mostly at centre forward, and is equally at home at centre half or wing half. A Welsh International.

LEWIS, BERNARD (Right Wing)

A most promising young player. A Welsh Youth International, he signed professional terms with Cardiff last season and gained his first team place after regular winger Alan McIntosh broke his leg in the F.A. Cup game against Leeds.

SCOTT, RICHARD (Wing Half)

A young player of fine physique who started his career with Norwich City. Can also play at centre forward. A relentless tackler, strong and resourceful.

FARRELL, GREGG (Outside Right)

Born Motherwell, he joined Birmingham City from a local amateur club and was with them for four years before signing for Cardiff in March 1964.

KING, GERALD (Left Wing)

A Welsh Schoolboy International from Kington in mid Wales. The youngest player to turn out for the senior side this season at 17 years of age.

HARRINGTON, ALAN (Wing Half or Full Back)

Yet another product of local football. Born at Cogan, he has had a brilliant career since making his debut in 1951. Capped on numerous occasions for Wales, he is equally outstanding at either full back or wing half. Another of Cardiff's injured players last season—he has now entirely recovered.

TAPSCOTT, DEREK (Centre Forward or Inside Forward)

A native of Barry, Tapscott was with his home town club before moving to Highbury in 1953, where he was a regular member of the Arsenal side before joining Cardiff City in 1958. He has played for Wales on 17 occasions.

TOMMY HALLIDAY (Centre Forward)

Signed from Dunbarton, for whom he scored numerous goals, he made his debut for Cardiff last season. Dedicated to hard training, he has recently lost over a stone in weight, and is fitter and faster than ever.

MURRAY, DONALD (Centre Half)

Born Duffus near Elgin. Played junior football for Burghead Thistle and joined Cardiff City at 15 years of age three years ago. Made numerous first team appearances last season and was a capable deputy for John Charles. Captain of the Scottish Youth Team last year.

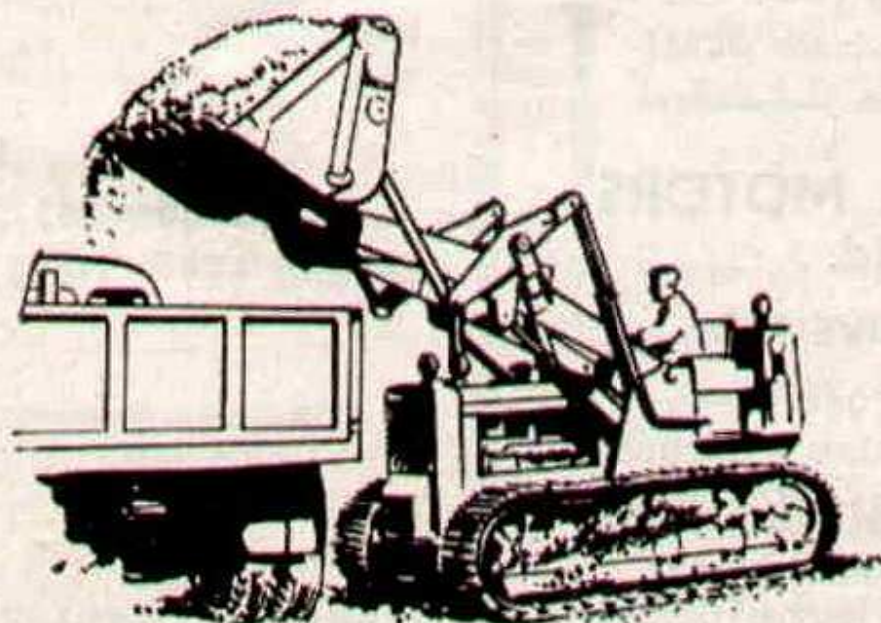
