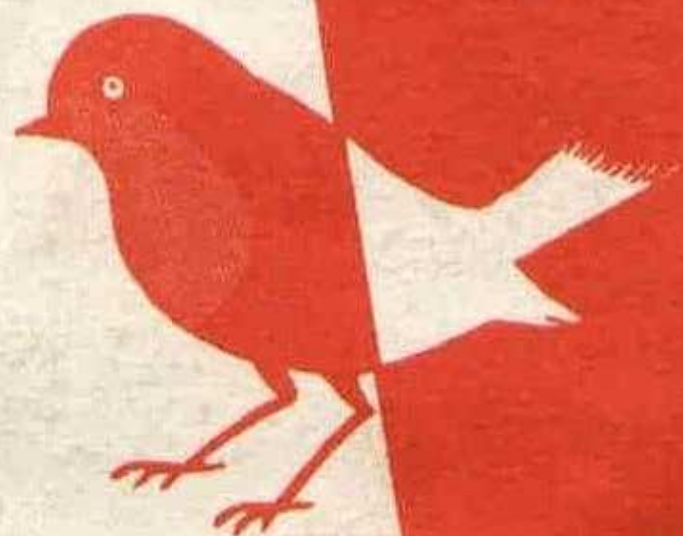

Even so, with the team playing an all-out attacking game, Swindon scored a third goal, and might easily have added two more when Don Rogers hit the junction of the crossbar and upright, and when Peter Leggett shot just wide of the far post.

Many teams would undoubtedly have closed up the game when leading 3—1 with ten men, and played purely defensive football. Not so with our lads, who continued to play in the same aggressive attacking spirit; much more entertaining for the spectators, but it probably cost Swindon a valuable point.

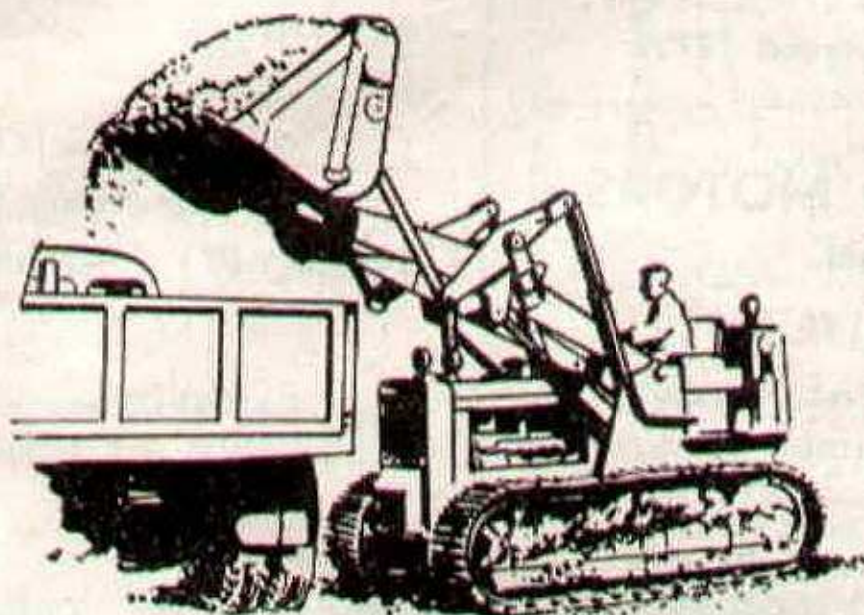

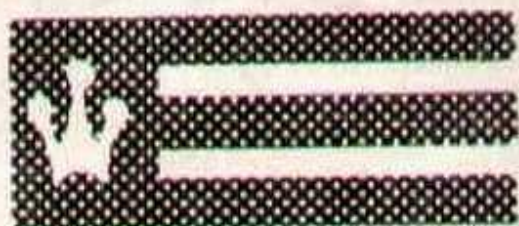
