

mand that the team plays in the right spirit. Also we said, referring to gamesmanship and time-wasting, "Spectators have a right to see football played for the full ninety minutes." It would appear that some of our spectators are not desirous of a full period of play.

In our last home game, i.e. versus Bolton Wanderers, a number were leaving the ground at least ten minutes before the final whistle. Unfortunately, this movement around the ground detracts considerably from the concentration of the players. It spoils the whole atmosphere and not only causes annoyance to supporters, but often interferes with their view of the game. We must therefore appeal most strongly to those supporters who occupy the ring seats, to remain seated until the final whistle has blown.

The seats around the ground are the cause of much concern on the part of the management. An unfortunate incident could easily stem from people sitting so near to the field of play. In that case and and also in the matter of movement, there is only **one** answer: the removal of the seats, and the prevention of any incident before it occurs.

Incidentally, we must state most emphatically that any spectator encroaching on the field will immediately be removed from the ground.

Today we entertain one of the great names in football — Newcastle United. What tradition that conjures up, and the famous names that spring to mind — Jock Rutherford, Colin Veitch, Peter McWilliam (later to become an outstanding manager with Tottenham), Sam Weaver (of the long throw), Bill McCracken (the offside specialist, and a great player—the man who really caused the change in the rule of offside), Hughie Gallager (a great Scottish centre forward), Neil Harris (for a short period prior to the 1939-45 War, manager of

Swindon Town), Ivor Broadis, Jack Milburn ("Wor Jackie" of centre forward fame), Jimmy Scoular (now manager of Cardiff City), Len Shackleton, Joe Harvey.

Newcastle was, until recently, the only club to win the F.A. Cup two years in succession — in 1951 and 1952. They have also won it on four other occasions, in 1910, 1924, 1932 and 1955.

Last season we drew 0-0 at the County Ground and were defeated 1-4 at St. James's Park. It is our turn to win. Prior to last year the teams had met twice before. In Season 1909-10 Newcastle United defeated Swindon 2-0 in the Semi-Final of the F.A. Cup, played at Tottenham. That was undoubtedly Swindon's finest era, the days of that great team: Skiller, Kay, Walker, Tout, Bannister, Silto, Jefferson, Fleming, Wheatcroft, Bown and Bolland.

The teams met again in 1938 in the First Round of the Cup, and Swindon (at home) won 2-0, and later played Burnley and the Arsenal.

A first class pivot secured from Bury in part exchange deal with Bobby Stokoe in 1961. Has played for England "Under 23's". Big and strong, and a first class defender.

BILLY THOMPSON (Centre Half)

A greatly improved player who sustained an injury last season to keep him out of the game. Born near Newcastle at Bedlington, he stands over 6ft. and weighs over 13 stones. 
RONNIE McGARRY (Forward)




