CLUB NOTES

The Christmas holiday was not such a happy and successful one as we all hoped.

Unfortunately, the game on Boxing Day was played on a very hard, slippery surface, when mistakes were so easily made.

In view of the weather conditions, the game itself was splendid, and certainly played in the right spirit by both teams. Few fouls (and those only technical ones), no delaying tactics or time-wasting, and certainly no questioning of decisions. Really good entertainment.

Swindon, rather unluckily we thought, lost another home game. They deserved at least one point. Norwich were a fine footballing side, playing well within themselves to a certain pattern. Swindon enjoyed by far the greater portion of the play, even in the second half when reduced to ten men, owing to an injury to Keith Morgan at the very beginning of this period of play. At times we were well on top, but our opponents' defensive play was first class. When it seemed certain the game would end in a 0—0 draw, Norwich scored a well-taken goal by inside-right Bolland, after a quick break out from a session of attacks by Swindon. To show that we are not in a position to spend large sums of money, we give below details of the financial side of the gate against Norwich on Saturday last, probably one of the largest of the season.

With a weekly wage bill of £1,130 that amount just covers the two weeks merely for wages alone. Nothing to meet the day-to-day expenses such as Rent, Rates, Heating, Lighting, Training expenses, etc.

Others have mentioned the terrific amount of running about done by some of our players during a game. The teams composed of players always moving and wanting the ball are the most successful. A really great player is one who moves into position to receive the ball. PETER WAKEHAM (Goalkeeper)

Devon-born. First played for Torquay United, then Sunderland, from whom Charlton secured him in June, 1962.

MICHAEL ROSE (Goalkeeper)

Last season was his first as a professional and he played in the majority of League games. Former Barnet and St. Albans City amateur.

JOHN HEWIE (Right Back)

Charlton's longest-serving player. First joined the club in 1949 and has made nearly 450 League appearances. Has played in nine different League positions, including goalkeeper. Played for Scotland seventeen times.

BRIAN KINSEY (Left Back)

Born at Charlton. A former Bromley amateur. Played for years at outside left, but last season was successfully converted to left back.

DAVID STOCKS (Full Back)

Born at Dulwich and is a product of London and Surrey Schools football. Signed professional in January, 1962 and made his League debut in April of that year.

MICHAEL BAILEY (Right Half)

Was secured from Gorleston in 1958, becoming a professional in 1959. England Under 23, and full international.

FRANK HAYDOCK (Centre Half)

Secured from Manchester United in August 1963. Born at Eccles and made a number of first team appearances with United — was earlier a Blackpool amateur.

BRIAN TOCKNELL (Left Half)

Comes from Pretoria and played for South Africa before joining Charlton in July, 1959 — is at home in any of the half-back positions.

MICHAEL KENNING (Outside Right)

Was secured from Shrewsbury Town in November, 1962. Previously with Aston Villa. Born at Birmingham.

Born at Slough, but learned his football at Arbroath, Scotland. Has filled most forward positions. Signed in April, 1957.

EDDIE FIRMANI (Centre Forward)

Returned to Charlton in 1963 after eight years in Italian football. An Italian international. First joined Charlton in 1950 along with Stuart Leary.

JIM RYAN (Centre Forward)

Ex-London policeman. Secured from the famous amateur club, Dulwich Hamlet, in February, 1963. Scored seventy-one goals last season.

CLIFF DURANDT (Inside Forward)

Cost Charlton their record fee when they secured him from Wolves in 1963. Comes from Johannesburg and is a versatile forward.

DENNIS EDWARDS (Inside Forward)

Former England amateur international. Secured from Wycombe Wanderers in 1959.

LEN GLOVER (Outside Left or Right)

A Londoner from Kennington who graduated through Charlton's junior teams. Became a professional in May, 1962.

KEITH PEACOCK (Inside Forward)

Born at Dartford. Signed professional in July 1962 when only seventeen and soon made his League debut. Can also play in the wing positions.

KEN JONES (Goalkeeper)

Joined Charlton in September last year after previously having several years' experience with Scunthorpe United; former Welsh Under-23 international.

RALPH MILLER (Full Back)

Joined Charlton in September 1963 from the amateur club Slough F.C.—made his League debut a few weeks ago.

CHAS. GOUGH (Wing Half)

Signed professional for Charlton last season on leaving the Army — former Scottish amateur international.

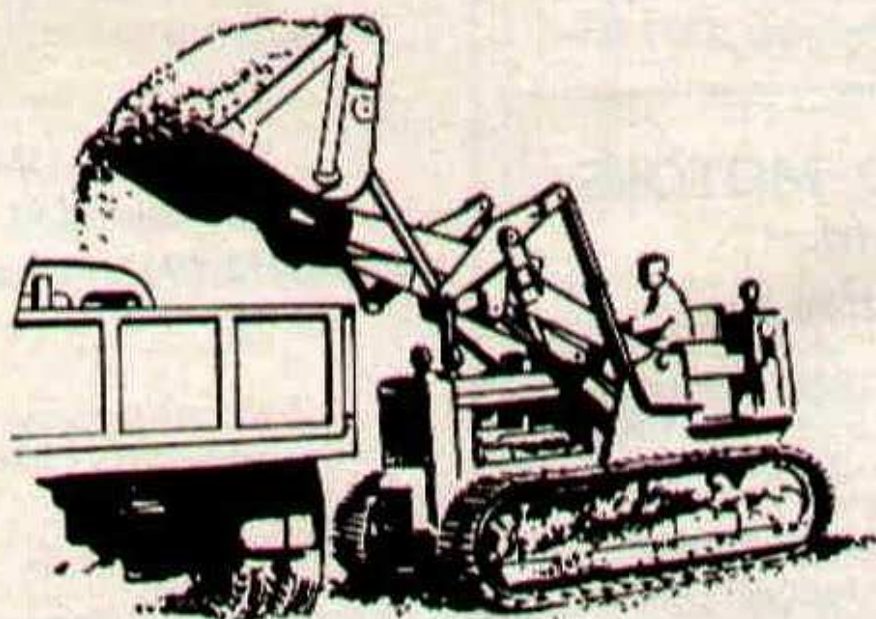

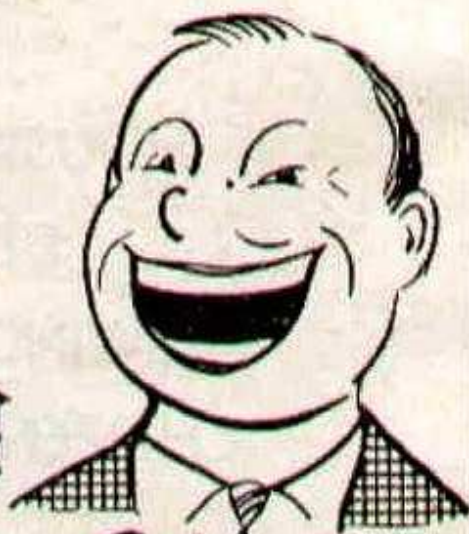

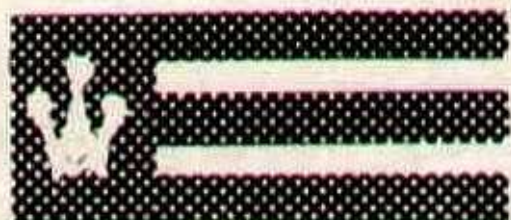
