SPOTLIGHT

NOW that Town's F.A. Cup interest has been "buried" for another year (though, goodness knows how long it will take Mr. Johnston's team to forget last Saturday's galling experience) it's back with a vengeance today to that vital battle of League safety.

February, indeed, brings us to one of the most critical phases of that survival campaign - THREE matches, two of them at home and two of them also involving opponents in the bottom half of the table.

Swindon, who beat us 4-1 in September, are today's visitors and next Saturday we entertain Coventry.

On February 20th - F.A. Cup fifth round day - our lads make the long trip to Portsmouth, another game which, like that of today, promises to be of "four-pointer" importance.

It would be dangerous to underestimate the opposition in these games, in Spotlight's view.

Before losing at Norwich last

week-end in one of the two Second Division games played that day, today's visitors had been enjoying their most successful spell of the season.

Swindon had, in fact, taken nine points from their previous six League games.

But then, there's hardly one of the Second Division's "bottom dogs" who aren't making a stong effort at the moment. Portsmouth, it is worth noting, also did very well to take a point from Southampton at The Dell before Town's visit.

Indeed, with fifteen games still to play, can any Second Division club lower than tenth position feel secure?

Not for a long, long time has the Second Division been such a tight race between pace-setters and so-called stragglers.

This doesn't mean, however, that teams like Town can afford to relax one instant. If they are to keep their sights on safety, Town must keep up a point-a-match average.

If we turn the League calendar back to December 5th – half-way stage of the 1964-65 season – we find that Town haven't quite measured up to that demand. They have, in fact, picked up six points from their last seven games.

There has, all the same, been a significant improvement in the side's scoring power.

Twelve goals have been scored in those seven games – more than half Town's tally in the previous twenty games.

Swindon's improvement has been largely in defence and there can be no doubt about it that manager Bert Head's decision to recruit Bury's Gordon Atherton at a £10,000 fee has proved a very useful step in the right direction.

In the eight games Swindon have played since the half-way stage, nine points have been accrued – and only four goals have been conceded in the process up to last Saturday's 3-1 defeat at Carrow Road.

It is to be hoped that the Town lads, thoroughly dejected as they must have felt after last Saturday's Cup defeat and that bitterly-disputed goal, haven't allowed "indigestion" to develop.

Seemingly everybody in the ground – Swansea fans included – were of the opinion that the Swansea centre-forward handled the ball in the act of scoring. How Town didn't get a penalty when Kevin McHale had his legs scythed from under him was another of the day's mysteries.

Town, however, mustn't let the disappointment of last week-end end affect their approach today.

GO TO IT, TOWN – and how about it you fans on the terraces showing them that you, too, are not downhearted!

Introducing . . .

THE Wiltshire side, who came up with Northampton two seasons ago, have not done so well this time as the Cobblers, Town's visitors a fortnight ago, but there have been signs of improvement in the last six weeks or so.

Swindon began their Second Division career with, for the most part, a homespun team and there are still several "local products" in the side. Manager Bert Head has, however, had to buy players for one or two positions, his most recent and notable acquisition being **Gordon Atherton**, signed from Bury for £10,000 on December 17th. This auburn-haired strong-tackling left-half made nearly 400 League and Cup appearances in his ten years with Bury, for whom he had been an ever-present in four of the last six seasons.

Atherton has certainly strengthened Swindon's defence, in which regulars this season have been **Norman Trollope** at left-back and **Keith Morgan** at right-half. Three players have been tried in goal. **Norman Oakley**, signed from Hartlepool United last March for £6,000, made an unlucky start this season. In the opening game at Bury he was injured after only six minutes and took no further part in the match, which Swindon lost 1-6.

Mr. Head later paid £8,000 for Scottish international goalkeeper **Frank Haffey**, from Celtic, but he has not held his place, and since early in December eighteen-year-old Swindon-born **Tony Hicks** has been between the posts.

Other defenders have been (at right-back) **Owen Dawson**, formerly a centre-forward, who joined Swindon from Portsmouth, and (at centre-half) **Ken McPherson**, also converted from centre-forward, who came from Newport County in 1961.

SWINDON TOWN

Swindon, like Town, have had their problems in attack, and six men have figured at centre-forward. Latterly, **Mike Summerbee**, normally the outside-right, has been leading the forwards – not without success – and another home product, fast, play-anywhere **Wilf Shergold**, has been on the wing.

Ernie Hunt, the club's leading marksman in the last four seasons and still heading the scoring chart despite his absence for several weeks after an operation for appendicitis, and newcomer **Dennis Brown**, secured from Chelsea for about £15,000 last November, are the inside-forwards, and **Don Rogers**, an ex-England youth international, has again been first choice at outside-left. Like Summerbee, Trollope and Morgan, Rogers is an ever-present this season.

Swindon have a poor away record, with ten defeats in twelve games and a goal average of 15 for and 35 against, but they have had two wins as visitors recently – 3-0 at Leyton and 2-1 at Maine Road, Manchester.

Blackburn R. 4 Town 2

TOWN'S visit to Ewood Park was in marked contrast to that of twelve months previously when their F.A. Cup clash with the Rovers attracted a record gate of 55,000. For this war-time fixture the attendance was only 2,470, despite the fact that both clubs fielded representative sides.

Rovers soon showed that they had a decided advantage in attack. **Weddle** went through from **Butt**'s pass to open the scoring early in the game and before half-time **Rogers** made it 2-0 when he converted a penalty kick given for obstruction of **Weddle**.

Shortly after the resumption a brilliant run by **Chew** gave **Butt** the opportunity to beat **Hesford**, and **Butt** later schemed an opening for **Weddle** to score Blackburn's fourth goal. The visitors' forwards did not come seriously into the reckoning until late in the game and then **Isaac** scored twice to put a better complexion on the score.

Butt, a former Town player, was the game's outstanding forward. His clever scheming and accurate distribution gave Rovers their attacking superiority and in addition to scoring

one of the goals he contributed to two of the others. **Butt** and **Rogers** made a formidable right-wing pair and **Chew**, a young local player, showed up well at outside-left.

Despite the four goals against it, Town's defence stood up to its work well, with **Young** a commanding figure at centre-half. The visitors' front line sparkled on only rare occasions and the Blackburn defence in which **Pryde** at centre-half and **Crook** at full-back were the key men, was not extended until late in the game.
