

All who have the well-being of the Football Club at heart will be feeling more and more despondent with the probability of the return to the Third Division looming darkly ahead.


Letters to the Press do not cut much ice, as all contain different solutions to remedy the decline, although most writers are unanimous in their opinions of the cause of it.





KEARNS, Michael David (Mick)—Left back
Height 5ft. 11ins., weight 12 stone. Born in Nuneaton and was recruited from Stockingford Villa. Signed as a part-timer on September 17th, 1955 and made his debut at left-half against Bournemouth on September 9th, 1957. Finished his engineering apprenticeship early in 1960, when he became a full time professional. Has made over 200 League appearances for the Club, including 36 during the 1962-1963 season. Whilst in the Forces he made over 30 appearances for the British Army XI at left back and was a member of their successful Touring Party of the Far East in 1962. Originally a wing half, he has been converted into an enterprising full back, always looking for the opportunity to go up and help the attack.

CURTIS, George William (George)—Centre half
Height 5ft. 11in., weight 13 stone. Born in Dover, he was one of four
players to join Coventry from Snowden Colliery. Made his League
debut against Newport in April 1956, when only 16. He gained 4
England Youth Caps before signing professional forms in May
1956 and since then has played with the Under 23 team against Holland. Whilst in the Forces played for the R.A.F. in representative
matches. Has already made over 300 League appearances for Coventry, including 45 in the 1962-63 season, and is Club Captain.

HILL, Brian William (Brian)—Wing half back
Height 5ft. 9ins., weight 12 stone. Born in Bedworth and was originally spotted playing for Nuneaton Schoolboys. Turned professional in August 1958, after a spell on the groundstaff. Made his debut at inside right versus Gillingham on April 30th, 1958, scoring a goal on that occasion. Formerly an inside forward, he has now developed into an outstanding wing-half, being very strong in the tackle. Made 37 League appearances 1962-1963 season, during which he scored one goal.

BRUCK, Dietmar Jurgen (Dietmar)—Wing half back
Height 5ft. 8ins., weight 11 stone 7 lbs. Although born in Danzig,
Germany, moved to Coventry at an early age. Joined the City straight
from school and worked in the office as a youngster. Was in the
Coventry Boys team 20 times whilst at school and has also represented England in a F.A. Youth team.

HUMPHRIES, William (Willie)—Right winger
Height 5ft. 4½ ins., weight 9 stone 12 lbs. Born in Belfast. He started his football career with Ards. Transferred to Leeds United in 1958-59

Dear Sir,

In view of the very high number of corner kicks which the "Town" have been awarded lately, the result of which have been stalemate, would it not be a good idea if they tried out a few variations on the normal type. Many First Division sides use the quick, short pass type which two players move quickly on to and open up the defence, also the long corner kick, which is met by the winger on the opposite side of the goalmouth. This, of course, depends on the player chosen for this purpose positioning himself clear of the crowded goalmouth. Trusting these two ideas might help to break up the succession of matches in which much good play has been wasted for the want of a winning goal.

season, but never settled down at Elland Road and was sold back to Ards. Came to Highfield Road in April, 1962 and made his debut against Hull City on the 28th April. He gained 11 full international caps for Ireland.

REES, Ronald (Ronnie)—Left winger

Height 5ft. 8ins., weight 10 stone. Born in Ystradgynlais and became a professional with Coventry on April 9th, 1962, after a lengthy spell as an amateur with the Club. Made his League debut against Shrewsbury at home on September 15th, 1962, and in the course of the 1962-63 season made 33 League appearances, during which he scored 4 goals. Has gained 4 Full International Caps and 6 Under 23 International Caps for Wales and has also represented the Birmingham County F.A. in the County Youth Competition.

HUDSON, George — Centre forward

Height 5ft. 10ins., weight 12 stone. Born in Manchester and as a schoolboy represented the North Manchester Boys. Began his professional career with Blackburn Rovers. Moved to Accrington Stanley on a free transfer and when this club folded up was transferred to Peterborough. Joined the City on April 5th, 1963 for a fee of £21,000, which is the largest fee paid by the Club in the transfer market.

HALE, Kenneth (Ken) — Inside forward

Height 5ft. 7ins., weight 11 stone. Born in Blythe and played for Northumberland Boys before joining the Everton groundstaff. Soon moved nearer home to Newcastle and made his first team debut as a 17-year-old. Was transferred to Coventry on the 14th December, 1962, for a fee of £10,000, and made his debut the following day against Notts County. Exceptional ball control and a fierce shot.

GLAZIER, William (Bill) - Goalkeeper

Height 5ft. 11ins., weight 13st. 2½lbs. Born in Nottingham. Joined the Crystal Palace groundstaff in 1961 after being released by Torquay United, and signed professional in the same year. Has represented the F.A. Youth XI. Has proved himself a fearless and very safe keeper. Transferred to Coventry on 16th October, 1964, for a record fee of £35,000.

HARRIS, Allan — Left back

Height 5ft. 8½ ins., weight 11st. Born in Northampton. Joined the Chelsea groundstaff as a boy in 1958 and became a full-time professional after gaining an England Youth Cap. Played a number of games in Chelsea's first team. Was transferred to Coventry in November, 1964 for a fee of £30,000.
