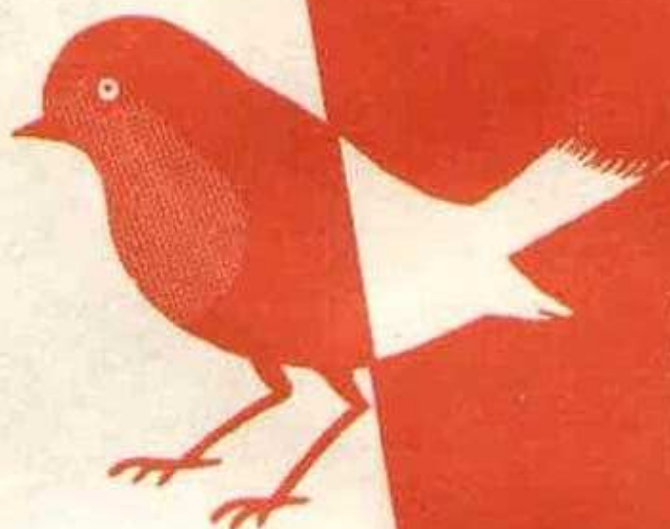

CLUB NOTES

Swindon Town v. Plymouth Argyle recalls many famous encounters. To older supporters the name Moses Russell is synonymous to Plymouth. No-one seems to know the origin of the name Argyle, but that certainly has been part of their title since the formation of the club in 1886. They gained promotion from the new Third Division (South) in Season 1929-30, since then they have had two spells back in that Division.

Today they occupy eleventh position in the league table, six places above Swindon. A win today would be most valuable to the home club, especially as earlier in the season Plymouth won at Home Park by two goals to one, the winning goal being scored by Cliff Jackson from the penalty spot. Another ex-Swindon player on the books is, of course, Dave Corbett, a product of this area.

In the early twenties Plymouth boasted some very famous

names, including "Bob Jack", the manager; Jack Cock, of Chelsea and Millwall fame, one of the finest of England centre-forwards; the left-wing pair of Leslie and Black; and inside-right Frank Richardson (later to become a Swindon player, and still associated with Reading, in charge of a junior team).

Talking of ex-players, many supporters will be sorry to hear of the death of Stan Wilcockson, a splendid left-half in the early 'thirties. During that period Swindon's half-back line read: H. Cousins, G. Morrall, S. Wilcockson. Have we ever bettered that combination? The manager, incidentally, was Ted Vizard, and the left-back, J. Smith.

This is our first home match since the Coventry game. Can we reproduce the form shown on that occasion? We certainly played well at Cardiff, especially in the first half, but were unfortunate to find the home goalkeeper in first-class form. Two goals scored from corner kicks settled the issue, and we returned pointless, despite the fact that Swindon was by far the better side.

The game at Ipswich was a bright, open affair, full of splendid attacking football. Both sides missed chances on a firm, fast-playing surface. Credit both defences, especially the goalkeepers, for keeping the score-sheet blank. Swindon almost grasped victory in the last few minutes when skipper Hunt, after breaking through, beat the goalkeeper with a skilfully-placed shot in the bottom corner of the goal, only to

see centre-half Baxter retrieve the ball on the line. Excellent anticipation on the part of the defender.

Nevertheless, a valuable and well-deserved point obtained from a team with an undefeated run of eleven games.

The Reserve Team still strives to obtain a place in the first three of the league table. We must finish in one of those positions to obtain promotion to Division I of the Football Combination.

Despite beating Q.P.R. Reserves by three goals to nil, Swindon remain in fifth position and yet we won at Coventry by five goals to nil and at Luton by five goals to one, and in both cases completed the double by winning the games at home.

However, Swindon has two games in hand of the four clubs above them, and could, with a little luck, win promotion. It would indeed be a great achievement and would result in some attractive matches on the County Ground next season. On the other hand, one must not lose sight of the fact that the Reserve team is the training ground for the Senior side. There experiments must be made and players tried out. Nevertheless, every effort must be made to win every game and move into higher circles, otherwise the whole business of playing league matches would be absolutely pointless.

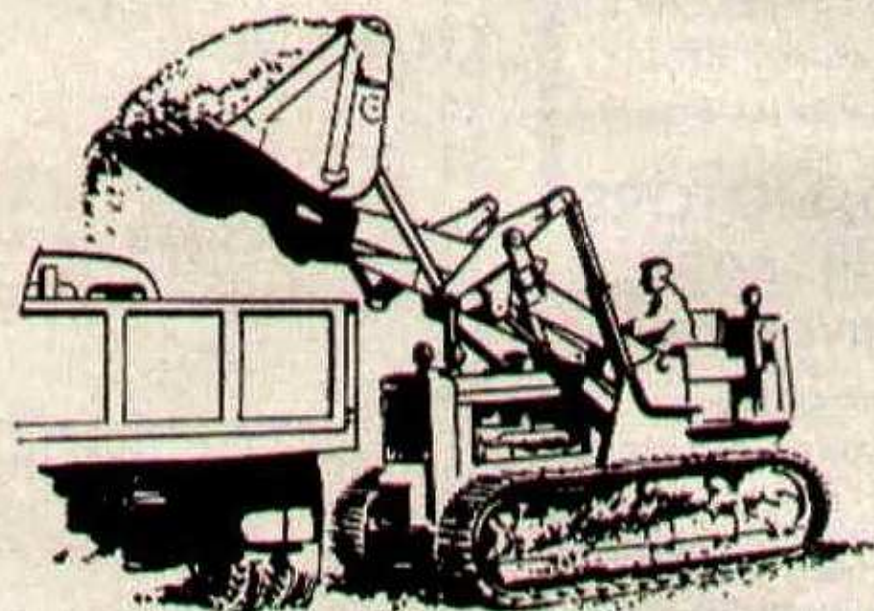

Born Saltash, Cornwall. Another local product. Commenced with Argyle as an amateur, signed professional in April 1960. Made his way through junior and reserve teams to make his first team debut at Home Park on November 24th, 1962 against Swansea Town. Height 5ft. 9ins., weight 11st.

WILLIAMS, John. Right-Half

Signed for Plymouth in 1955 from a local team and has made over 300 first team appearances. Born Plymouth. Height 5ft. 9ins., weight 11st. 7lbs.

NEWMAN, John. Left-Half

Born Hereford. Joined Birmingham City 1951 and appeared at Wembley in the 1956 Cup Final, when Birmingham were beaten by Manchester City. Transferred to Leicester City in 1957. Joined Plymouth Argyle 1960. Height 5ft. 11ins., weight 12st. 4lbs.

NEALE, Duncan. Wing-Half
