CLUB NOTES

This evening we entertain a club with which we have been acquainted for a very long time. Like us, they joined the original Southern League when it was founded in 1901. Many of our supporters still remember with pride and joy those days when the name of Swindon Town F.C. rang throughout the football world, the period 1909 to 1914, when Swindon reached its highest zenith ever. The great names—Sam Allen, Charlie Bannister, Harold Fleming, Harry Kay, Billy Tout (the penalty king), Bob Jefferson. Those were the days when we played our finest football: not so fast as at present, but great, entertaining stuff, which brought the crowds, although then men worked in the factories until 12 o'clock on a Saturday morning.

At that time great rivalry existed between Swindon and Northampton, and when one season we won the championship, Northampton presented Swindon with a model train with the names of the clubs marked on the carriages in league table order. This train is still retained in the club offices, and many still feel it ought to be on show more to the public.

When Division III was formed from the old Southern League in 1921, Northampton and Swindon found themselves partners as original or founder members.

CLUB NOTES—continued

Today, 68 years after their formation in 1897, they appear to be favourites for promotion from Division II, and thus becoming a Division I club for the first time ever. This will be a great achievement for a club who only a few seasons ago were in Division IV of the Football League, in fact only four years ago.

A great tribute to club, players and manager, especially when one considers the support accorded the club. This season, although being very near to the top of the league from the beginning, their average gate has only been just over 12,000. There certainly cannot be any fantastic wage structure on those figures. Their largest home gate last season was 18,000, and that was against Swindon, who on the day was accompanied by quite 6,000 supporters.

Most of the Directors have been members of the Board for many years, and have known the ups and downs of football. The hard times in Division IV, the long hard slog back, and although they now have a successful team, feel it is still a difficult uphill struggle to keep going. The manager, Mr. D. Bowen (ex-Arsenal), was in charge in the Division IV days, and has brought the team through to its present pride of place.

Well done, Northampton!

Talking of managers, it was at Northampton that the greatest manager of all time began his career—Herbert Chapman, later to be manager at Leeds and Huddersfield, but to make his name at the Arsenal in that club's hey-day in the early 1930's, when it won the Championship of Division I four years in succession.

Other famous names who served as managers at Northampton are Syd Puddefoot (a great centre-forward), Jack Tresadern, later manager of Plymouth and Tottenham, and Bob Dennison.

Dear Sir,

Would it be possible to print in the programme the teams and results of the previous week's matches, also a list of the 1st and Reserve team appearances and goalscorers with the Football Combination League table, now it is nearing a climax in which we have a real interest?

Could you inform us by your official comment, the latest up-to-date news of the situation regarding the proposed new stand?

Comment: We reply to this request with great pleasure, and print in the current programme complete summaries of the players' appearances in Division II and Football Combination, goal scorers and match details of games played last Saturday and during the week.

The New Stand: Two seasons ago the Board formulated plans for a new stand on the northern side of the ground. The Town Council (who, incidentally, are our landlords and the planning authority), suggested the building of a much bigger and grander structure, and consulted Professor Nevvi, the Italian architect responsible for building many of the fine continental stadiums. He produced some wonderful plans, but it was felt such a building was not suitable for English climatic conditions. Visits were then made to see stands at Liverpool and Peterborough, both excellent. A new idea has now come on to the market known as the Banbury, which can be built in sections. Such a stand has been built at Coventry, and the Club's architects are looking into the possibility of a similar stand in sections at Swindon. Many factors are involved, such as costing, siting, dressing-room accommodation, supporters' clubroom, refreshment bars, etc.

The main problem is one of finance. To build a stand for £150,000 (a mild estimate) would cost at least £12,000 per annum, or £250 per week in interest charges alone, plus repayments of capital.

The Development Fund stands at £25,000, a meagre figure compared with the first one mentioned. However, if football is to continue in Swindon, a new stand is absolutely essential.

To date, in spite of various items in the Press, no definite plans have yet been formulated, let alone passed. There is not the remotest chance at the moment of work beginning this summer. The whole affair must be carefully worked out and the new stand prefabricated, and erected in sections, gradually replacing the old.

The Board will explore all possibilities most thoroughly, before coming to its final decision.

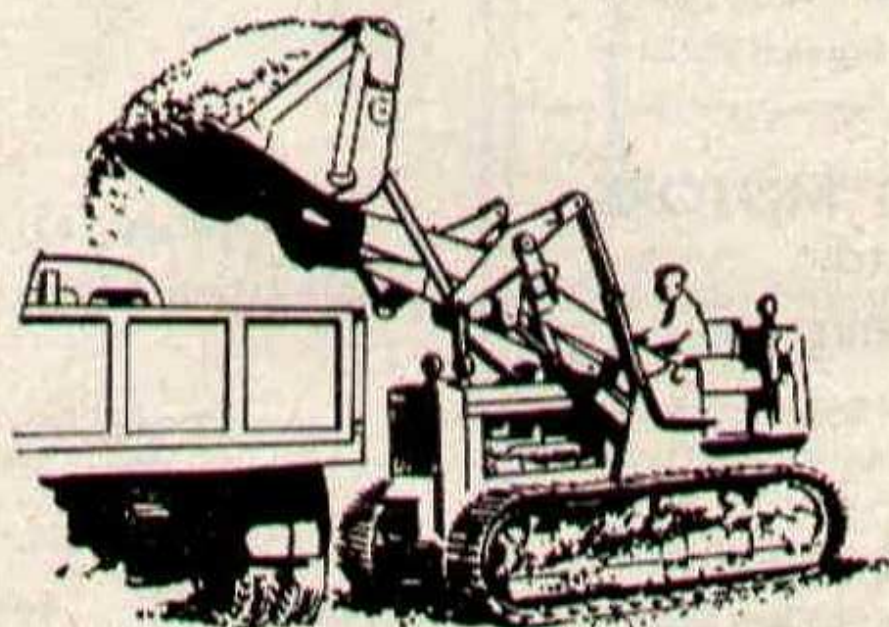
Ken Exton and his Orchestra have been engaged for the evening, and we hope for a good attendance of members.

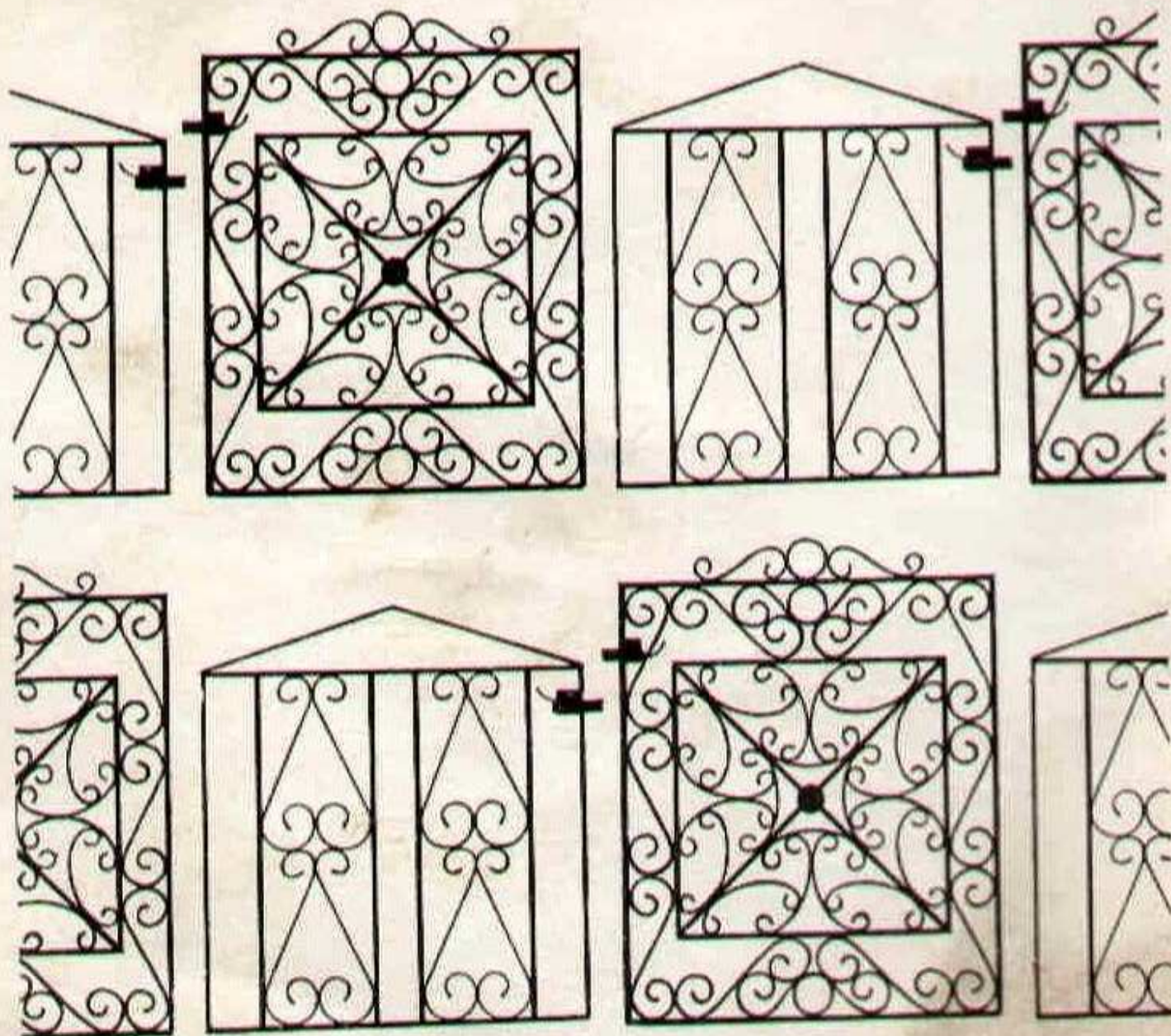
