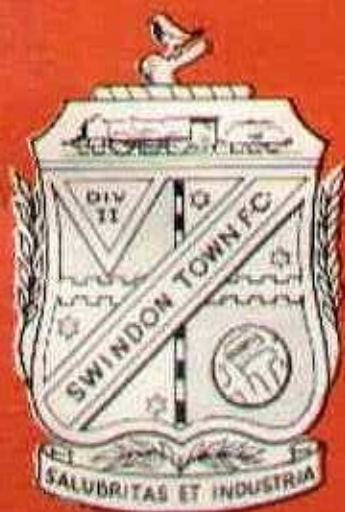
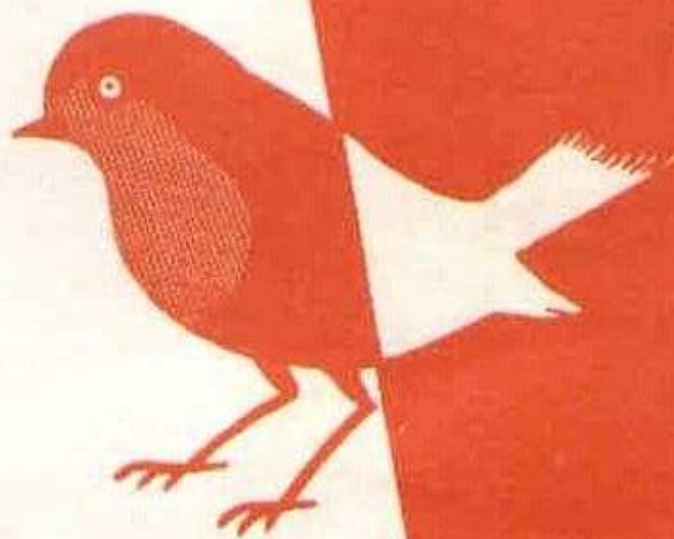

CLUB NOTES

This afternoon we have the pleasure of entertaining a club known throughout the world. Middlesbrough will have the honour of staging some of the World Cup games next year.

In this programme we give further details regarding those matches. Supporters who wish to apply through our Club, before the bookings are open to the public, should make early application. These must be received by **May 10th, 1965.**

Regarding today's game: before last season the two clubs had never met, either in Cup or League. The results: Middlesbrough 1, Swindon 0; Swindon 2, Middlesbrough 0.

In November last, when the two clubs played, the result was: Middlesbrough 4, Swindon 1. So we have a score to settle.

The only other connections between the two clubs happened before World War I. Swindon's left-back, Jock Walker, was transferred to Middlesbrough, later to be joined by Bert Davies. The latter, of course, returned to Swindon and gave years of service at outside-left, and then became the club's assistant secretary, retiring from that post two years ago. He is still very active, working for the welfare of Swindon F.C.

CLUB NOTES—continued

Important Note

- (a) Single Tickets for the Semi-Finals and the Finals cannot be offered for sale.
- (b) The purchasers of 7, 4 and 3 Match Season Tickets will be eligible for inclusion in the Ballot for tickets for the Final. It is likely that purchasers who do not obtain tickets in the Final Ballot, will be offered the opportunity of tickets by Ballot for the 3rd and 4th Place Final or the Semi-Finals.
- (c) The Ballots for Final, 3rd and 4th Place Final and the Semi-Finals will be conducted electronically, early in 1966.

Application for Tickets

- (i) Applications for Season Tickets by Clubs in Full and Associate Membership and by County Associations of The Football Association should be made on the official Application Forms.
- (ii) Club and Association Secretaries should notify their members immediately that they may apply for World Cup Season Tickets.
- (iii) All applications should be consolidated by Club and Association Secretaries and submitted in bulk to the World Cup Office as soon as possible, and not later than the final priority date of 1st June, 1965.
- (iv) All applications should be made by post.

Payment

No orders will be considered unless accompanied by the cost of tickets ordered together with postage.

Should it not be possible to supply a complete allocation of tickets, a refund for the difference will be made.

Security

In order to minimise the misuse, loss and possible forgery of tickets, the World Cup Organisation will issue in the first instance, Receipt Vouchers to all applicants.

Tickets will not be distributed until April, 1966.

Club and Association Secretaries are asked to take all possible precautions to see that tickets do not get into the hands of speculators or ticket touts.

Any supporter wishing to purchase World Cup tickets should apply for a Ticket Application Form to the Secretary, S.T.F.C., County Ground, Swindon.

Postal applications only, and enclose a stamped addressed envelope.

HOME SALES

Season Tickets. Four grades of Season Tickets are available for advance sale.

Ten-Match Season Tickets. For the period 12th to 30th July, 1966. This ticket covers all Eighth Final matches in **any one group** (A, B, C or D) together with the Quarter Final in the same group, one Semi-Final, the 3rd and 4th Place Final and the Final.

Seven-Match Season Tickets. For the period 12th to 23rd July, 1966. This ticket covers all the Eighth Final matches in **any one group** (A, B, C or D) together with the Quarter Final in the same group.

Four-Match. These will be for all Eighth Final matches played on a particular ground, together with the Quarter Final at that ground.

Three-Match. These will be for all Eighth Final matches played on a particular ground.

Method of Application. Applications for tickets by home purchasers will be made on the official application form, which can be obtained either from the offices of The World Cup Organisation, from the local club, or from local Box Offices from 1st July, 1965.

Applications for Ten- and Seven-Match Season Tickets should be made direct to the offices of The World Cup Organisation.

Applications for Three- and Four-Match Season Tickets should be made to the Box Offices at the grounds where the matches are to be played. Applications for single tickets for the Final only cannot be accepted. All applications must be accompanied by cheque or money order to the total cost of tickets ordered, plus postage.

Issue of Receipt Vouchers. No tickets will be issued at the time of application. Receipt vouchers to the value of the tickets requested will be dispatched immediately, as proof that the order has been received. Tickets will be sent to purchasers in April, 1966.

SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

The following is an extract from the leading article of the "Sunday Express" of 21st March:—

VICTIMS

Who suffers in the dispute between the F.A. and the players over televising the Cup semi-finals?

It is primarily the public which supports the game.

Fans queue for hours to get semi-final tickets. But, inevitably, many are disappointed. Their only way of seeing these matches is on television.

Let the two sides talk sensibly before it is too late.

The players have a legitimate grievance in that their fee for live TV is only £10 a head, less than the pay of a chorus girl in a 90-minute show. The F.A. has a legitimate need to increase its revenues.

If a sensible compromise is not reached, then let the public think twice in future before it goes to football matches at all.

Fortunately, the difficulties regarding the televising of the Cup semi-finals were resolved with goodwill.

The article quoted appeared on the day following Swindon's match with Plymouth Argyle, when spectators were "victims" (the word used by the Press) of the tactics adopted by the Argyle goalkeeper, who indulged in some of the worst time-wasting activities (or inactivities) ever witnessed on the County Ground.

Mr. Cliff Lloyd, the Secretary of the Players' Union, is right to exercise vigilance on behalf of his members.

He should also remember that they are public entertainers and that they have a responsibility to give the public that for which it pays and has a right to expect, and should warn his members accordingly.

Managers who countenance these tactics should be censured also, for they too have a responsibility to the general public — "the victims".

However, there was ample compensation for Swindon spectators a few days later, when Northampton visited the County Ground. The

game was packed with thrills and there were two splendid goals by the visitors in the first half.

The second half will long be remembered, when Swindon replied with four goals — three of which earned special mention.

We hope for another good game today, and, perhaps, two further points to ease the League position, although our visitors also need them.

We are pleased to know that the injured players are progressing, and hope that they will soon be in action again.

These notes are being written just before our Dinner and Dance, and it is not possible, therefore, to comment on what it is hoped will be an enjoyable and successful event.

The proposal of the League Authorities that a bonus point shall be awarded to a team for every four goals scored in a match should be worthy of serious consideration. It has certainly met with general approval, judging from the views which we have heard.

We wonder what Swindon's position in the League would have been in 1926/27, when 100 goals were scored, and Harry Morris obtained 47 of them. The Town finished fourth in the table. Surely the bonus points which would have been awarded would have brought promotion many years earlier.

If the proposal comes into force it should result in the production of the type of football which the "victims" earnestly desire. At any rate, it would appear to merit a trial.

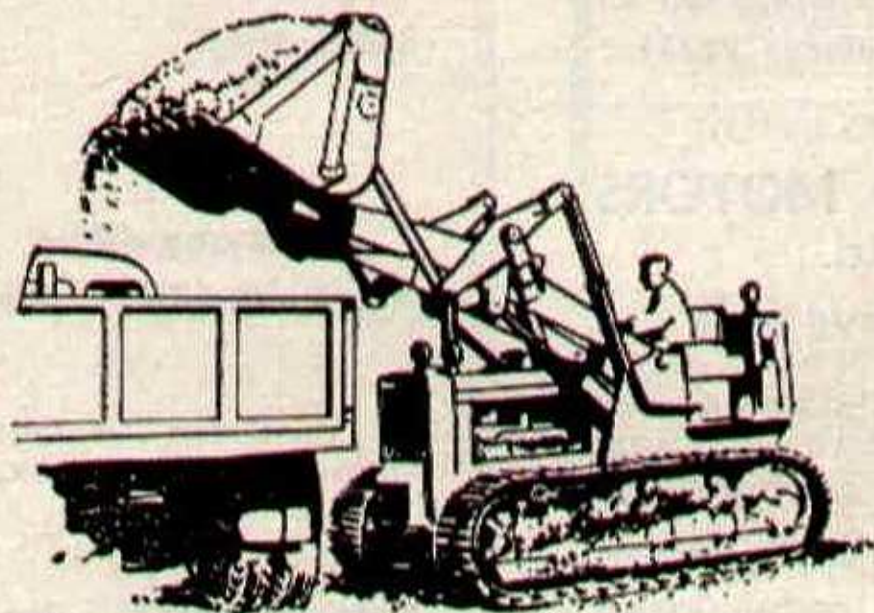

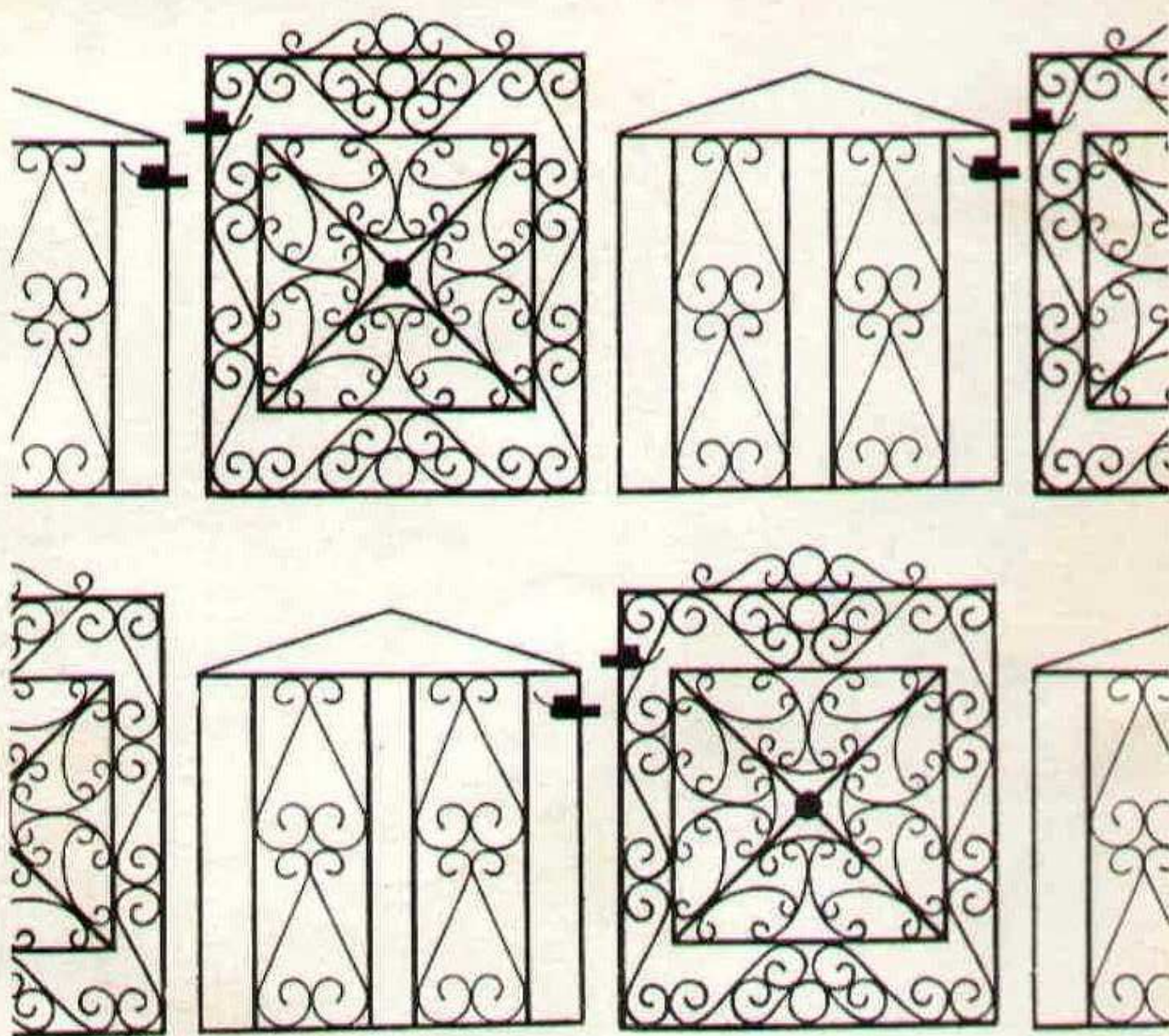
