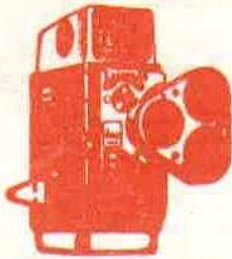

## SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

Today, August 28th, 1965 - will recall memories to many Supporters. Many years ago a young boy joined the Vetch Field staff, who was in the opinion of experts, one of the greatest discoveries of this age, and who as time proceeded, developed in keeping with the predictions, and in those days the phrase "golden" was only applied to the very great - and this young boy became known as "the Golden Boy of Welsh Soccer" - today he returns - and one cannot find a better term than that of the Junior Supporters who today state "Welcome home Ivor" - and all supporters will welcome Ivor Allchurch back. At the same time as Ivor was playing for the Swans, English League scouts discovered another local boy, who was destined to play his football in England, and the Club he joined was Derby County - a name to be conjured with in English League soccer and to whom he rendered yeoman service. However he returned to his native soil for a short time, but to all who knew him it was in the managerial field his talents would find great scope and he succeeded to the managership of Yeovil in the West Country. The writer met many supporters of Yeovil at Scarborough in the summer, and they spoke highly of Glyn's managership. However since that time he has become our manager and his ability would have won him the managership of a Football League Club previously, but fate decreed it should be Swansea. The difficulties facing the young manager are many and it is the earnest desire of the Supporters' Club that all will give him the support, cooperation and tolerance in his first plunge into League Club Managership.

# ANSWERS

1.—That when centre-forward Jack Palethorpe was secured from Preston North End by Sheffield Wednesday in December, 1934, figured in their Cup-winning team in that season, and was transferred to Aston Villa in November, 1935.

2.—Newcastle United. Tom McDonald did so from centre-half against Cardiff City on Christmas Day, 1926, and William Imrie from right-half against Wolves on April 21st, 1934, in First Division games, and Duncan Neale from right-half against Fulham in the F.A. Cup on January 7th, 1961.

3.—Yes. A Disciplinary Committee on September 29th, 1953, stated they were "not satisfied" that the referee had been justified in sending off G. Bowler (Millwall) in a match at Watford on September 1st., and decided that "no further action be taken."

4.—Only three, John and Mel Charles and Ivor and Len Allchurch having played for Wales, and Danny and Jackie Blanchflower for Ireland.

5.—The late Sam Wynne scored twice for each side when playing for Oldham Athletic against Manchester United (Second Division) on October 6th, 1923, and the late Herbert Roberts (Arsenal) put through his own goal twice in a minute against Derby County (First Division) on October 8th, 1932.

6.—Manchester United - in season 1947-48, when they shared the Maine Road ground with Manchester City. Both clubs were drawn at home in the fourth & fifth rounds, and United played Liverpool at Goodison Park and Charlton Athletic at Huddersfield.

## SWINDON TOWN

**TONY HICKS (Goalkeeper).** Born Swindon. Another product of Swindon Junior football. Extremely agile and fearless. Signed professional September, 1962.

**JOHN TROLLOPE (Left-Back).** Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960/61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961/62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962/63/64/65.

**GORDON ATHERTON (Wing-Half).** Born Horwich. Signed from Bury for a substantial fee December, 1964. He is a strong relentless half-back.

**KEITH MORGAN (Right-Half).** Born Trowbridge. A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962/3/4.

**TOM HALLET (Centre-Half or Left-Half).** Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United July, 1963. Fast and tenacious player.

**OWEN DAWSON (Full-Back).** Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

**MIKE SUMMERBEE (Outside-Right).** Born Cheltenham. He is another product of the Swindon youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own.

**ERNIE HUNT (Inside-Right).** Born Swindon. Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16 years of age, he is a player of outstanding ability, for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal-scorer 1960/61 and 1961/62. Capped for England Under 23's during 1962/63.

**DONALD ROGERS (Forward).** Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.

**DENIS BROWN (Inside-Forward).** Born Reading. Joined the Club from Chelsea for a very substantial fee in November, 1964. A fast raiding inside-forward he made several appearances at centre-forward last season.

**ERIC WEAVER (Forward).** Born Rhymney. Played as an amateur with the Club and also Trowbridge Town in the Southern League. He joined Swindon as a professional in August, 1965. A useful player in most positions in the forward line.

**NORMAN OAKLEY (Goalkeeper).** Born Norton on Tees. Joined the Club from Hartlepool's United in March, 1964.

**ROGER SMART (Wing-Half).** Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

**WILFRED SHERGOLD (Forward).** Born Swindon. Another product of the Swindon youth policy. He is fast and can play in almost any position in the forward line.

**BILL ATKINS (Inside-Forward).** Born Solihull. Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of 1958/9 Season. A strong, ball-playing forward. He played several representative matches while in the Army.

**ALAN SPROATES (Wing-Half).** Born Hetton. Signed from Sunderland August, 1963. Ball-playing wing-half.
