PEN PICTURES OF SWINDON TOWN PLAYERS

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH (Goalkeeper). Signed at the commencement of the Season from Halifax Town where he was a product of local football. A fearless agile player who has done much to strengthen the town's defence.

OWEN DAWSON (Right Full-back). Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth, June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Left Full-back). Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960/61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961/62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962/63/64/65.

KEITH MORGAN (Right Half-back). Born Trowbridge. A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962/63/64.

TOM HALLETT (Centre Half-back). Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United, July, 1963. Fast and tenacious player.

GORDON ATHERTON (Left Half-back). Born Horwich. Signed from Bury for a substantial fee, December, 1964. He is a strong relentless half-back.

DONALD ROGERS (Outside-right). Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.

ERNIE HUNT (Inside-right). Born Swindon. Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16 years of age, he is a player of outstanding ability, for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal-scorer 1960/61 and 1961/62. Capped for England Under 23's during 1962/63.

KEN KEYWORTH (Centre-forward). Another recently signed player. Led the Leicester City attack in the 1962-63 F.A. Cup Final and scored City's goal in a match won 3—1 by Manchester United. He was also at inside-left in the 1960-61 final, when Spurs beat Leicester 2—0. He left Leicester for Coventry City from whom he was signed.

KEITH EAST (*Inside-left*). Born Southampton. Signed from Portsmouth in the close Season 1964. A strong forceful player. He scored 20 goals in 26 games for the Club's Reserve Team which gained promotion to Division I of the Football Combination last season.

ERIC WEAVER (Outside-left). Born Rhymney. Played as an amateur with the Club and also Trowbridge Town in the Southern League. He joined Swindon as a professional in August, 1965. A useful player in most positions in the forward line.

ROGER SMART (Wing Half-back). Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

ALAN SPROATES (Wing Half-back). Born Hetton, Signed from Sunderland, August, 1963. Ball-playing wing-half.

DENNIS BROWN (*Inside-forward*). Born Reading. Joined the Club from Chelsea for a very substantial fee in November, 1964. A fast raiding inside-forward, he made several appearances at centre-forward last season.
