FOOTBALL GOSSIP

Workington's progress in the League Cup at Stockport was a heartening performance in more ways than one, and a home draw against attractive Brentford in the next round gives hope of another extended run in this competition.

The pity is that clubs are still finding it exceedingly difficult to establish the League Cup as a serious competition in the minds of the fans.

In some ways I can't help thinking that the clubs, in a way, are to blame themselves.

Because several leading Lancashire clubs are drawn at home they are now seeking to "stagger" the playing dates in order to avoid a clash of fixtures.

Will the Football League allow them to do so? Almost certainly.

Would the Football Association allow them to switch F.A. Cup dates around under the same circumstances? Certainly no.

The League Cup has been run on such uncertain lines since its inception that no one has taken it really seriously—not the big clubs, anyway.

The League make a big mistake in allowing its top teams to refuse to play. The League make a big mistake allowing clubs to switch and change dates at will. The League should do its darndest to give the competition a new image.

Workington's two trips to the quarter finals in the past may have covered them with a certain amount of glory, but from a financial point the income was nowhere near what it would have been had their success been in the F.A. Cup competition.
