CLUB NOTES

This afternoon we play our third successive home game. Shall we continue in the splendid winning vein (Reading 5-0, Merthyr 5-1), and the spate of goals?

One thing seems very certain — the attendance. Our gates this season have been excellent. At the moment they tend to be higher than last year, when we played in Division II.

On Saturday, the number of spectators at our F.A. Cup match, against a Southern League team, was by far the highest in the competition. It was, indeed, greater than at most Division II games, and even some in Division I.

Swindon's figures were 15,962. Compare those with the following in Division I:—

Blackpool v. W.B.A. (Top of Div. I) — 12,642.

Fulham v. Notts Forest — 13,863.

Sheffield United v. Everton — 16,579.

Is it because our ground is easily accessible? It certainly is on the eastern and southern sides of the town. There is also good parking space available, although complications may arise if when Queen's Drive finally becomes a dual carriageway, it is declared a clearway. However, we will cross that bridge when it comes.

Meantime, it is surely the style of play which is attracting the customers. It is what supporters want and what they deserve. Fast, open attacking football, complete absence of gamesmanship, wasting time, kicking away and standing on the ball, and, probably what is best of all, no arguments, no dissension or questioning of decisions. It is also pleasing to see the quiet confidence in defence. Splendid covering and marshalling. No risky play and giving away of goals. Above all, no blaming one another. Every man doing his job, and also assisting his colleagues with encouragement and help.

Long may this continue. While supporters like to see their team win, we think they will forgive everything if the present entertaining football is played.

CLUB NOTES—continued

This afternoon we welcome to the County Ground, Mansfield Town. If memory serves us right, we think the last time the teams met was in Season 1959-60 when, unfortunately, our visitors lost their place in Division III (South).

The writer has an outstanding memory of a visit to Mansfield. On 25th April, 1959, Swindon Reserves played there. Our team was Medlock; Lee, Lockey; Reeves, Jack, Morris; Corbett, Morgan, Woodruff, Hunt, Jackson. Note the date April 1959 — six years ago — and note the ages of some of the players at that time. When our party walked into the ground, we rather felt some of the home supporters thought we had arrived with the Boys' team. The result was Mansfield 7, Swindon 0. However, all five of the forwards are still in football, and we wonder how much has been involved regarding the transfer of some of them. The end justified the means.

The 2nd Round F.A. Cup draw has not been very kind to Swindon. As supporters know, we have to travel to Grant-ham, a Midland League team. We must be playing the farthest north team in the Southern section of the competition. The task confronting the team is a difficult one. Non-league sides are hard to beat in the Cup competition, especially on their own grounds. They have everything to gain and nothing to lose. With our team in its present form, we feel confident that we shall at least draw, if not win.

CLUB NOTES—continued

Including the 2nd Round Cup-tie, Swindon now face three away games — Queen's Park Rangers, Grantham, and Scunthorpe. On 18th December we play Millwall at home, and do not appear on the County Ground again until the Tuesday after Christmas, 28th December, when we play Grimsby Town, kick-off 7.30 p.m. How we hope the weather will be better than that we are experiencing today (Monday). Referring back to this afternoon's game, when the teams last met on 23rd April, 1960, the following represented Swindon:— Burton; Higgins, Bingley; Morgan, Chamberlain, Tilley; Summerbee, Hunt, Mellor, Gauld, Darcy. Result—Swindon 2 (Chamberlain, Mellor), Mansfield 1 (Hollett); Attendance 7,967; Receipts £767. Positions at the end of the season:— Mansfield 3rd from bottom (36 points), Swindon 16th (46 points), Southampton 1st (61 points), Norwich 2nd (59 points).

One final note: everyone connected with the club will be delighted with the news that Ernie Hunt is selected to play for England Under-23 Team against Yugoslavia on Wednesday, 24th November at Southampton, k.o. 7.30 p.m.

Ernie is still very much a Swindon boy at heart. He never misses an opportunity to pop in at the County Ground (often taking part in training sessions) or to greet his old friends around Mannington Recreation Ground. Congratulations and best wishes for a grand game Ernie, although (dare we say it?) "The Dell" is not one of your happy hunting grounds. However, there is always a first time.

It is hoped that our allocation of tickets for the Cup-tie at Grantham will be available on Tuesday next. If they are received in time, they will be sold at the Reserve game against Southampton. Tickets at 4/- and 5/- (standing) will be available for this all-ticket match. It is regretted that we cannot receive postal applications for tickets.

Mr. Fred Evans, Secretary of the Wiltshire Football Association, died early this week. He gave the whole of his leisure time (in fact almost his life) to football, starting right from the bottom — junior football — to become greatly respected as the Senior Administrator in the county. Not only Wiltshire, but football throughout England will miss him greatly. Swindon Town F.C. offers its condolences to his family.

It is with the deepest regret we record the death of Dr. Gibson. No club ever had a finer servant or supporter — a great man, and the kindest of all. For many years he was the Club Doctor, and did everything possible to help the players. The writer never once heard him say anything against anyone, and certainly no-one spoke a word against Dr. Gibson—everyone loved him. He will be sadly missed, not only by Swindon Town F.C., but also by the “old people” of the Town, and the blind, for whom he did so much.

The Club received another great shock when it heard of the death of Mr. Francis Louis, F.R.C.S. Our players and many thousands of people in the district have much for which to thank Mr. Louis. A fine surgeon and a fine man, with an exceptional sense of humour, and deep sense of devotion to duty.

We offer our deepest sympathy to the families of these two charming and wonderful men. Swindon, in fact the whole area, will be much the poorer for their passing.

What more can we say except “Thank you, Dr. Gibson and Mr. Louis, for your example, your fortitude, your work, and the great joy you gave to so many. Our lives have been made much the richer by counting you both as our friends.”

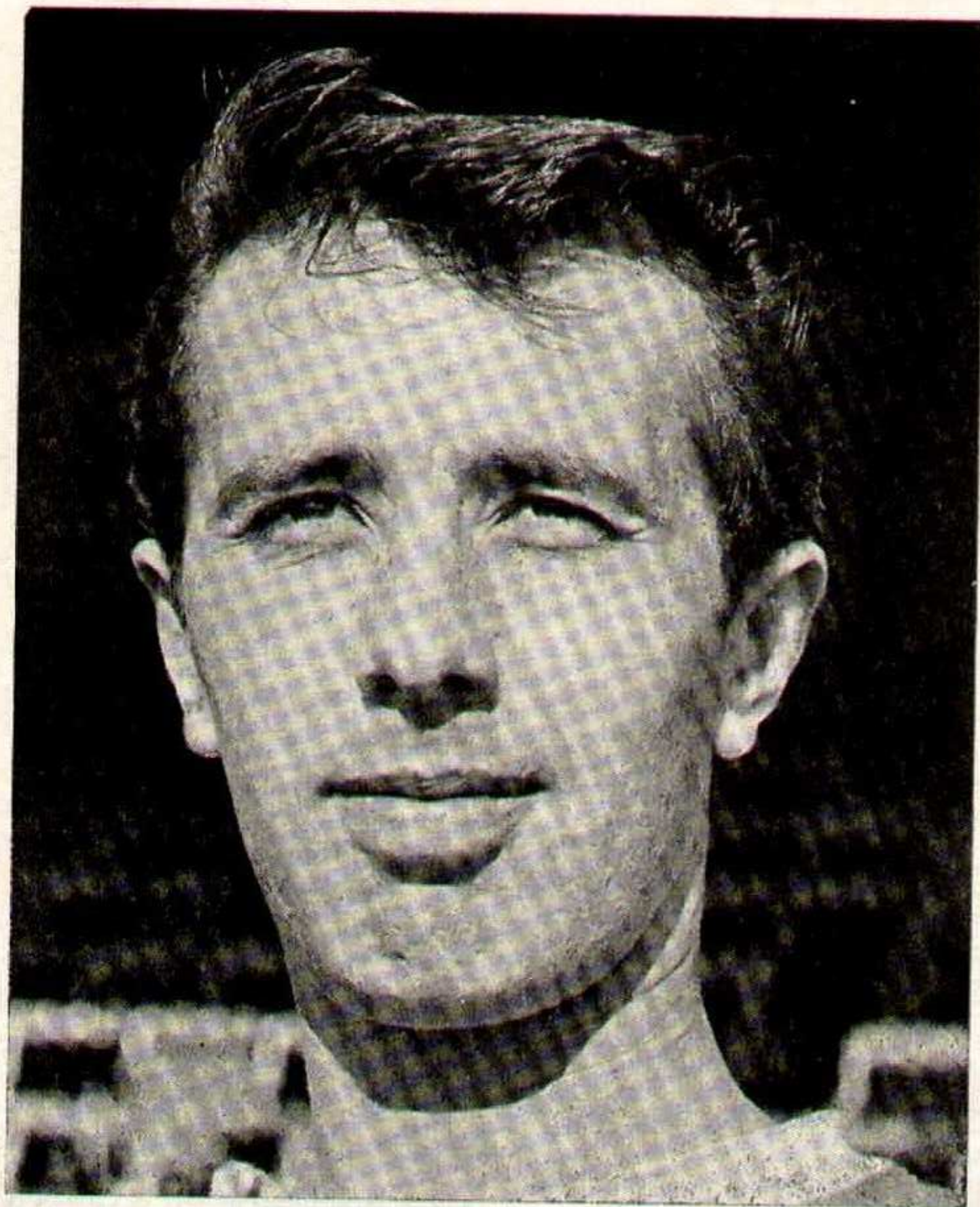

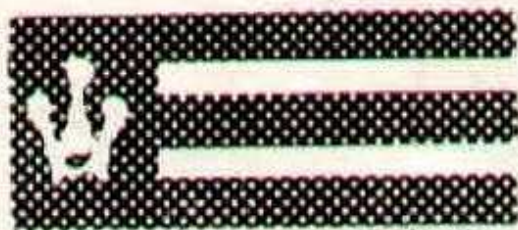
