Two certain "firsts"

— Maybe Three

We've been in the Second Round before, but that was away to Wigan in 1928 when we lost 2-1.

And so, today, history is made—the first-ever F.A. Cup Second Round tie is to be played at Grantham; Swindon Town are making their first appearance at London-road; and, we assume, a ground record attendance (previous best 6,257 for a qualifying round in 1947) will be established.

All this adds up to another big step in our advancement.

The fact that we won the Midland League championship in 1963-64, were runners-up in 1964-65 and are at present sitting with the league leaders, and now the Cup run . . . all this amplifies the determination to keep Grantham in the forefront of non-League affairs.

The lean years prevented anything being done beyond gradual team and status rebuilding, so, with continued good support we can, perhaps, begin at long last to put into operation the ground development plan which has remained "at the ready" for the moment when finances permitted its emergence.

AN OLD WISH

We have long wished to improve conditions for club supporters, and we shall do what we can, when we can.

True, we have limitations at Grantham, but we like to think we are a "homely" set up, and at this point we say how pleased we are to welcome supporters of both sides, visiting officials and Press men, and those of you who live around these parts but come to see us only now and again.

Soccer—particularly the Cup—generates "heat" and excitement, but we are proud of our efforts to date and we are no less proud at having this opportunity of meeting our Third Division rivals from Wiltshire.

Maybe for Swindon to lose today would be a more bitter blow, generally, for them than it would be for us to at last reach the end of this season's Cup road, but come what may, remember, please, what we asked of you last time—enjoy it to the full; go the "full hog" so far as legitimate fan participation is concerned; but above all do let's behave ourselves and show yet another new band of visitors you're what we said—a good set of supporters. Against Hendon you were a credit. Keep it up.

Oh! And talking of credits, we would like to express thanks to the Cricket Club for their prompt co-operation when we asked consent to "build" on the reserved side of the ground.

In all our pre-match preparations we have tried to ensure, under the generalship of the manager, that we are as ready as we can be for the big match.

Peter Downsbrough—Goalkeeper. Signed from Halifax Town at commencement of the season. Fearless, agile player who has done much to strengthen Town's defence.

Norman Oakley—Goalkeeper. Born Norton-on-Tees. Joined club from Hartlepool United in March 1964.

Joe Butler—Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August. Tenacious player whose speed and ability make up for his lack of inches. Born Newcastle.

John Trollope—Born Swindon. Joined ground staff from school. Selected for first team beginning of 1960-61 when 16 and an ever-present that season and in 1961-62. Maximum appearances in League side during 1962-63-64-65.

Owen Dawson—Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth, June 1962. A former youth international.

Mel Nurse—Recent signing from Middlesbrough. Has many Welsh international caps and needs little introduction. His ability and experience have done much to strengthen the defence.

Gordon Atherton—Born Harwich. Signed from Bury for substantial fee in December 1964. Strong and relentless half-back.

Keith Morgan—Born Trowbridge. Strong attacking wing-half who joined Swindon as youth player from Westbury. Maximum appearances during 1962-63-64.

Tom Hallett—Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United in 1963. Fast and tenacious.

Roger Smart—Born Swindon. Joined Town direct from Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 made the centre-forward berth in second team his own; later converted to wing-half.

Wilfred Shergold—Born Swindon. Another product of Swindon youth policy. Fast and can play in almost any position in the forward line.

Eric Weaver—Born Rhymney. Was in Southern League with Trowbridge Town. Joined Swindon as professional in August.

Ken Keyworth—Recently signed. Led Leicester City attack and scored in 3-1 defeat by Manchester United at Wembley in 1962-63 final. Also in 1960-61 final when Leicester lost 2-0 to Spurs. Joined Swindon from Coventry.

Keith East—Born Southampton. Signed from Portsmouth close season of 1964. Strong, forceful. Hit 20 goals in 26 games for Swindon Reserves last season when they gained promotion to Football Combination, Division 1.

Don Rogers—Born Paulton. A much sought-after player. An England youth player who only last week gained England Under-23 international cap against Yugoslavia.

Bernard Griffin—Born Merthyr Tdyfil. Joined club in August 1963. Strong attacking wing-half.

Dennis Brown—Born Reading. Joined club from Chelsea for substantial fee in November 1964. Fast raiding inside-forward. Made several appearances at centre-forward last season.

Eric Skeen—Born Cheltenham. Originally played as amateur with the club, but subsequently joined Trowbridge Town and re-joined Swindon as a professional in September 1964.

Jimmy Lawton—When Swindon played Darlington in Football League Cup earlier this season Lawton was one of Darlington's outstanding players. Swindon immediately signed him. Strong and forceful leader. Scored 28 goals in Darlington first team in 1964-65.

WHAT COINCIDENCES!

There are still many folk that we know who still come to London-road, yet can remember that 1928-29 season when Grantham last reached the Second Round of the F.A. Cup.

But do they remember the clubs that Grantham accounted for on the way before going down 2-1 at Wigan?

It all began on September 29th, 1928, when Grantham were drawn away to the Notts. Amateur club Boots Athletic in the first qualifying round, but Boots decided to switch the tie to Grantham—and they lost 6-0.

Grantham were next at home to their then closest rivals Newark Town and played a goalless draw on their own ground, but won the replay 3-2 at Newark.

And so to the third qualifying round and a visit to Sutton Junction. This was a good day for the Black and Whites from a result point of view, for they triumphed 6-1, but the economics that day were a trifle heartbreaking to say the least. Grantham returned home with their share of the encounter amounting to 2s. 1d.!

But, as it does these days, the competition was warming up, and the fourth qualifying round gave Grantham a home tie with Scunthorpe United, before, then and after to be keen Lincolnshire rivals of ours before they ultimately gained Football League status.

There was a crowd of 1,700 at London-road on November 10th, 1928, to see Grantham go through to the competition proper with a victory by the odd goal in three.

And so to the First Round, at home against Rhyl, which ended in a 1-0 success before 3,500, and the 2-1 defeat before 7,500 at Wigan.

PENALTY SAVES

In remembering that Cup run of old it cannot be overlooked that goal-keeper Stan Walker, still in the town—he's licensee at the Earlesfield Hotel—stopped a vital penalty against Rhyl. But it is not so clearly remembered that he also stopped a spot-kick in that most important replay at Newark.

With this season's run to Round Two more clearly in our minds, it is, perhaps, interesting to compare the respective records—and what coincidences!

In both 1928 and 1965 Grantham were drawn at home on four occasions out of five; in each year there was a drawn home game and a replay win; in each year the team prevented opponents from scoring on three occasions; and, would you believe it, the goal average each time proved to be identical at 4.5!

So the only real departure has been a home tie in Round Two. And seeing Grantham lost narrowly on that day long ago, maybe an even more noteworthy departure today would be a win and a first-ever appearance in Round Three.
