

### MANAGERS NOTES

We are now approaching the time of the year when the weather has a pronounced effect on the league results. It is rarely that a player has the good fortune to play on a ground where the conditions are ideally suited to playing football, and going further than that it is rare that a ground is similar two weeks on the run.

And perhaps, going even further yet, there are pitches which vary considerably in different parts. As an example, it is often the case when frost and snow has been around, and the sun has thawed it out, that shadows cast by a stand will have prevented that section from thawing.

I have always believed that this is one of the strongest reasons for playing summer football, the fact that ground conditions would eventually lead to a more skilful player. So when you see someone mistrap a ball, or shoot wide from a good opportunity, don't forget that ground conditions can play an important part.

### SWINDON TOWN

This afternoon we give a welcome to Swindon Town, who are making their second visit to the Old Show Ground. Relegated at the end of last season, after a brief spell of two years in division two, Swindon are making a strong bid to regain the higher section.

After what must be termed as a moderate start to the campaign, they have fought their way up to fifth position in the Third Division table, and with 21 points from 19 games they are still well in the running for honours.

Away from home their record is of an average nature, three wins and two draws from 12 games played.

Playing at the County Ground, Swindon have one of the most attractive enclosures in the division. Their record attendance of 28,582 was set up in an F.A. cup game against West Ham on February 16, 1964, a game that also produced the ground record receits of £5,471.

The club was founded in 1881, and they were among the original members of the third division in 1920. The following season they were placed in the southern section when the divison was split into two. In 1958 they were placed in the third division, at the time of the

split into divisions three and four, winning promotion to the second division when finishing second to Northampton Town in 1963.

Swindon had to apply for re-election in 1933, and struck another bad patch in the mid fifties when for two seasons in succession they had to again apply for re-election.

Their success of recent seasons has been built up round a highly successful youth policy, which has brought them many young players from the junior age groups.

Last season their most successful marksman was right winger Mike Summerbee with 13 goals.

### CLUB NOTES & NEWS

What a splendid recovery our first team has made in the Third Division. From being right at the bottom at the end of September, with only four points from eight games, we have now climbed to 13th position with 18 points from 17 games.

Last Saturday's splendid performance when beating York City by 3-1 at Bootham Crescent - where we were claimed to have been the best team to have visited the ground this season - was our fourth away league win in succession, and brought our points to tally to 12 out of a possible 14 in the last seven games.

Surely such performances will be reflected in increased attendances, and especially when our supporters realise just how wide open the Third Division is at present. It is significant that we are now only six points behind Hull City in second place, and have two games in hand.

The most striking feature of our recovery has been the way in which the forwards have suddenly found their shooting boots. In the four games played since loosing to Oxford at the Old Show Ground, they have scored 12 goals - an average of three a game.

We would congratulate Jack Hutton on the way he came in to fill the bill at centre forward for the York game. A most encouraging performance Jack.

Our Juniors did well to get a second round F.A. Youth Cup re-play as a result of this week's game against Hull City at Bootl ferry Park. The result was a 1-1 draw, and with a little more luck in front of goal our lads would have won at the first time of asking.

The re-play takes place at the Old Show Ground next Tuesday with a 7-30 start, and we hope that many of our supporters will be present to cheer the youngsters on.

After to-day's game against Swindon, the first team has two hard away Third Division games, at Bristol on December 18th, and against Shrewsbury on December 27. They then return to the Old Show Ground on Tuesday Dec. 28 for the return game against Shrewsbury, which it is hoped will draw a big attendance.

### WORLD CUP NEWS

The language of football is universal. For many people that universal language is English. In these days, however, this is something of a fallacy. Have you stopped to realise that if Scotland are beaten by Italy in Naples on Tuesday next, December 7, the final 16 in the World Cup Competition in England in July next will contain only one English-speaking nation?

Such is the way that soccer progress has crept up on an almost unsuspecting world in the period following the end of the Second World War that the qualification of North Korea, even to a public accustomed to surprises, came as something of a shock.

Russian, Hungarian, Italian, French, Spanish and Portuguese are languages which will be heard every day next July in the group areas staging matches in the World Cup Final Series. Perhaps then, and only then, will English supporters who have come to regard football as England's game appreciate the true global aspect of what started in England from such small beginnings.

Belgium or Bulgaria, and Italy or Scotland have to join West Germany. France. Portugal. Switzerland, Hungary, the Soviet Union, Spain, England, Uruguay. Chile, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico and North Korea to make up the final Series contingent. But in addition to their own followers. they will have spectators something like another 100 countries watching their every move. No sport can be more universal than that.


